

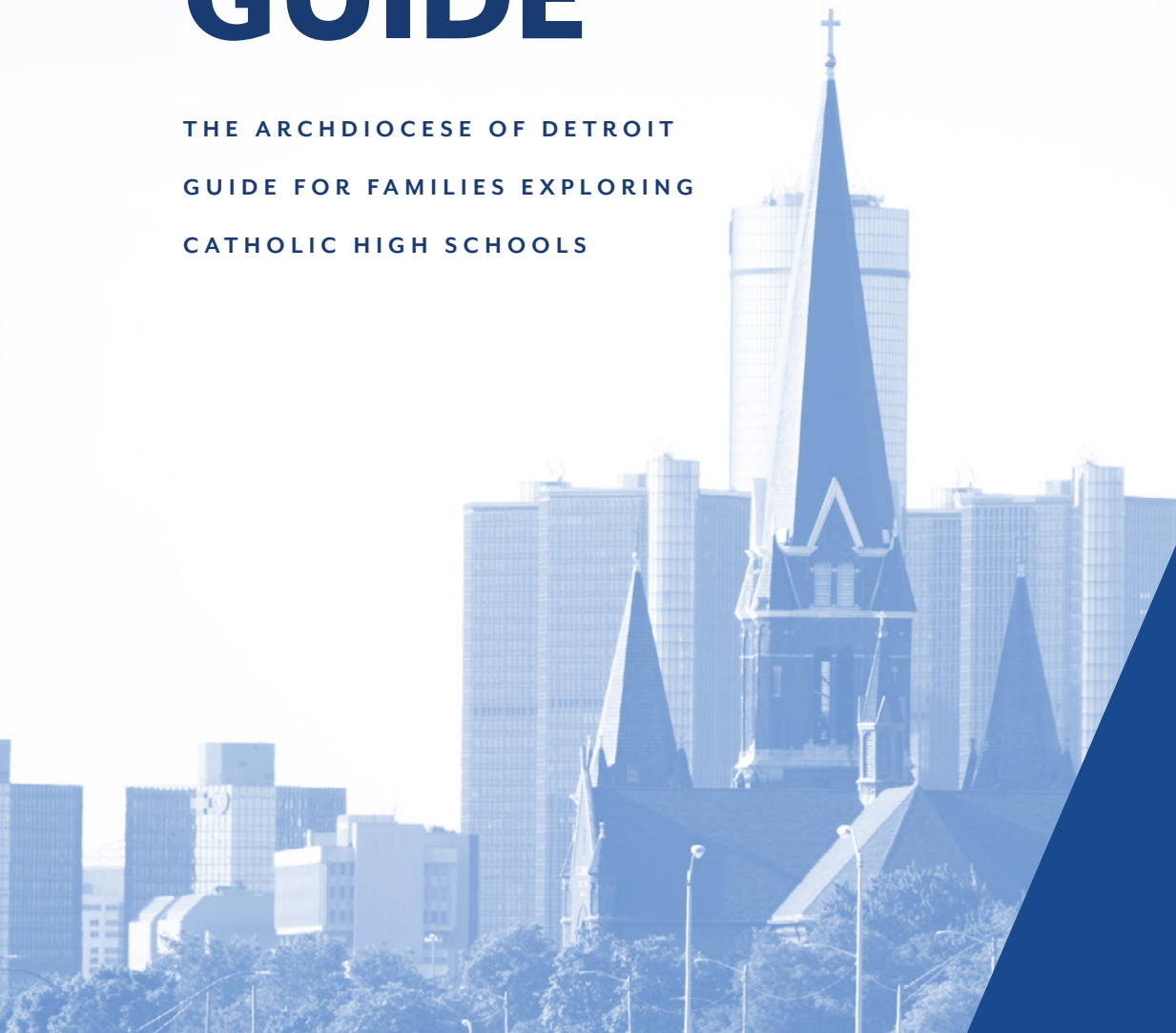

 - » Most Catholic high schools offer scholarships and financial aid to families. Contact the schools directly to learn exactly what options you have.

FAITH DEVELOPMENT:

Catholic identity is in the forefront of life at Austin Catholic High School. Students lead daily prayer and mass is scheduled weekly. Additional liturgical programs run throughout the year as well as community service opportunities to meet service experience requirements for graduation. Retreats focus on the core values of truth, unity, and love. True to our Augustinian mission, we encourage students to develop a lifelong commitment and passion for service to others. Service is experience-related and required all four years at Austin Catholic High School.

UNIQUE ACADEMIC OFFERINGS:

Austin Catholic prepares its students to think critically, solve problems creatively and work independently. Student learning plans are tailored to the academic needs and abilities of the student throughout the four years. Academic opportunities and advancement are available through honors class sections, CTE opportunities, advance placement, and dual enrollment at community college. Our STEAM program includes core math and science curriculum as well as fine arts and religion components to solve real-life problems. With new science labs, a fine arts curriculum and team-taught classes, students experience a full range of academic and fine arts related learning. Ninth, 11th and 12th grade seminars support students with mini units on study skills, SAT/ACT prep and college and career readiness. All students participate in "minimester" a two-week exploratory unit designed to meet graduation requirements. During minimester, students select a variety of experiences ranging from sewing to historical sites in Michigan to designing a pop-up store business model. Minimester focuses on group engagement, core values and life/career skill development.

FAITH DEVELOPMENT:

We provide students with a faith-based learning environment both inside and outside the classroom. While 87% of our students are Catholic, a multitude of other faiths are represented within our community as well. Students are required to take four years of theology courses, attend weekly mass, participate in annual class retreats and complete at least 52 service hours over four years. We also participate in a variety of extracurricular events and activities, including a schoolwide day of service and various student-led outreach projects and initiatives.

Bishop Foley's college preparatory-based curriculum is comprised of over 100 course offerings, including more than 20 AP and honors classes. On average, our class sizes are no more than 18 students per classroom, ensuring that we prioritize individualized instruction and foster meaningful connections between our teachers and students. We also provide a variety of learning accommodations for students who require them. Additionally, we offer a variety of hands-on exploratory electives and dual enrollment opportunities for our students through approved colleges or universities.

FAITH DEVELOPMENT:

Four years of theology required; Twice weekly all-school Mass required for all students; Daily Mass offered; Reconciliation offered throughout the week; Annual retreats required; Service hours required each year; Weekly Adoration available; Weekly Bible Studies available; Praise and Worship evenings offered.

UNIQUE ACADEMIC OFFERINGS:

FGR Curriculum is aligned to foster interdisciplinary learning. Primary source texts are used wherever practical and science and mathematics courses emphasize hands-on learning and an integrated approach to STEM education. FGR offers a Capstone program that goes beyond AP. This elective offers students an opportunity to explore in depth an interdisciplinary topic of their choosing, preparing to present a 30-minute presentation at the end of the semester as a culmination of their high school learning experience. Philosophy electives complement our theology courses. We offer a variety of advanced science courses including Honors Anatomy and Physiology and Advanced Chemistry (also known as Food Chemistry) as well as AP Chemistry, Physics C, and Biology. Currently, a total of 10 AP courses are offered across the curriculum.

Retreats, reflections, and mission trips are offered at each grade level, highlighted by our Kairos retreat. Community service is a hallmark for U of D Jesuit, as we partner with organizations, such as Focus: HOPE and Gleaners Food Bank throughout the year. The capstone of service program is the Senior Service program which has been a staple at U of D Jesuit since 1971. Our seniors spend 14 Wednesdays throughout the school year volunteering at soup kitchens, food pantries, schools, or medical facilities for an entire day.

UNIQUE ACADEMIC OFFERINGS:

U of D Jesuit offers 32 honors and AP courses, as well as dual enrollment opportunities to allow students to challenge themselves at a high level, beginning in 7th grade. Students can further challenge themselves by taking classes through the Arrupe Virtual Learning Institute (AVLI) which connects students to a network of Jesuit educators around the world. Our Arrupe Learning Center provides support to all students with learning challenges. Peer and faculty office hours are also available for those students who seek additional help.
