

A MESSAGE FROM FR. STEVE

Beginning Lent Well

Many of you gathered on Ash Wednesday to begin our Lenten Journey together. The Lord delights in the response of His people to the call to repentance and self-denial. As the Gospel Wednesday made clear, the Lord invites us to three wonderful practices during Lent. Through the Church, the Holy Spirit calls each of us to pray, fast, and give alms. The Lord says, in each instance, *when you pray, fast, and give alms*. The point is that to be Christian *is* to pray, fast, and give alms. That is what sons and daughters of God *do*, for it reveals to us what they *are* in Christ. We are called to be intimate with our Father in heaven, so we *pray*. We look forward to our home in heaven and want our appetites to be tuned to eternal things, so we *fast*. We are parts of one Body, sharing in the challenges of those around us, so we *give alms*.

Growing in Prayer

My prayer this Lent is that we will all grow in prayer this Lent. Praying to the Lord from our heart is a great practice all the time, and Lent can be a special invitation from Him to do so. The prayer of prayers is the Mass, and I encourage you to attend Mass during the week, if you've rarely (or never) taken time to do so. Another opportunity for each of us is to make a visit to Jesus sometime during the day, especially on Fridays when we have exposition throughout the day, or during our Holy Hours on Tuesday (from 7-8 p.m.) or on Friday (from 7-8 p.m.). We will also be praying the Stations of the Cross on Fridays at 6:30 p.m., which is a great Lenten tradition. Let's pray well, that we will all be drawn deeper into the heart of Love this Lent.

Fasting for Him

Lent is a wonderful time to depend upon the Lord to help us master the desires of the flesh. Fasting from particular foods or beverages can help us remember that our hunger and thirst is ultimately for heaven. Another area of fasting that would please the Lord very much would be a fasting from images (TV, video, or internet). In this age, we are bombarded with images and sounds, which makes it difficult to carve out time for prayer.

Lumen Veritatis

This coming Saturday evening (February 17), Dr. Nathan Schlueter will give our next *Lumen Veritatis* lecture, which is entitled, "A Reclamation of Catholic Social Teaching." Dr. Schlueter is Professor of Philosophy and Religion at Hillsdale College, where he teaches courses in social and political philosophy, ethical theory, Roman Catholic theology, philosophy, and literature.

The evening will begin at 7:00 p.m. at the Lansing Catholic High School Auditorium with food, drinks, and fellowship. The talk will begin at 7:30 p.m. and will be followed by questions and answers. Please plan to join us. And bring a friend.

Save the Date (Fr. Jacques Phillipe)

Please save the date for our March *Lumen Veritatis*, which is co-sponsored by the Resurrection Altar Society. Fr. Phillipe's talk, entitled, "Interior Freedom," will be held on Thursday evening, March 15 in Mercy Hall. The evening will begin at

7:00 p.m., and the talk will begin at 7:30 p.m. I believe that all these evenings are very much worth your time, but I would definitely encourage you to prayerfully consider joining us for this presentation by one of the contemporary Spiritual Masters of our time.

New Video Blog

Brian Fink, our Middle School Religion & History teacher, also serves as our Director of Catholic Culture. He oversees our *Lumen Veritatis* Lecture Series and has recently begun a video blog on our website. I encourage you to watch his "Welcome to the Res Video Blog" introduction, which is linked from our main page, as well as regular blog updates. Last week, he offered some great reflections on how to make good use of the Holy Season of Lent. Please pray for Brian, along with all our teachers, that they will all help our students (as well as us) become the saints we are called to be in Christ.

40 Days for Life (Planned Parenthood on Clippert)

Planned Parenthood of Frandor began performing chemical abortions over a year ago, which is why that is the location of 40 Days for Life this year. Beginning February 14th, please join us in prayer on the wide public berm on Clippert St, across the from PP in Frandor. Our efforts are prayer and fasting, not confrontation. Please consider coming out to pray. Be a witness for Christ. Be a witness for Life.
