



SCHOOL NEWS

RESURRECTION

The school year has started off well. I am excited about what the Lord has planned for us this year. We have 150 students enrolled from Kindergarten to 8th grade. This puts us at 75% of our enrollment capacity. Thank you for the continued prayers for the school, our staff, and our families. We are so blessed by the support of our parish!

The continued increase in enrollment has created more need for part-time employment within the school. We are currently accepting applications for a part-time instructional aide during 1st grade reading / math groups, and it would be nice to add more substitute teachers to our call list. Both positions are paid hourly, but substitutes are paid a flat rate of \$80 for a full day.

The 1st grade instructional aide would support 10 hours of classroom activities throughout the week. The times would be coordinated with Mrs. Dubiel, our 1st grade teacher. The ideal candidate would have experience (homeschool or classroom) teaching reading and math to younger students.

Substitute teachers must have completed at least 90 credit hours of college coursework, with at least at 2.0 GPA. Prior experience in teaching is preferred, and based on each candidates preferences, we can limit sub requests to certain grade levels or subject areas.

Resurrection School partners with parents in providing a nurturing Catholic environment focused on academic excellence, where students grow into disciples who know, love and serve our Lord Jesus Christ. Therefore, all staff positions are ministry positions within the Church. Applicants must be practicing Catholics who are enthusiastic about witnessing their faith to our children. The successful candidate must be diligent and willing to work collaboratively. Successful candidates will be required to complete background checks and virtus certification.
