

A MESSAGE FROM FR. STEVE

Lumen Veritatis (Saturday, April 21)

This (Saturday) evening, you are invited to join us for our April *Lumen Veritatis* lecture. This month, we welcome Dr. Dennis Marshall, who will present "Blindness of Spirit: Reflections on the Spiritual Life in a Sensualist Age." Dr. Marshall is a Professor of Theology at Aquinas College in Grand Rapids. The evening begins with drinks and simple appetizers at 7:00 p.m. at Lansing Catholic High School. The talk will begin at 7:30, followed by questions & answers and then fellowship. We typically wrap up the evening around 9:00 p.m. It's a great opportunity for adults in the parish and community to come together to grow in our knowledge of our faith, and to spend time focusing on the Good, the True, and the Beautiful.

Save the Date for Joseph Pearce: May 19th

Our final *Lumen Veritatis* lecture of this season will be held on May 19th, when Joseph Pearce, author of many biographies of literary giants including Shakespeare, J.R.R. Tolkien, C.S. Lewis, G. K. Chesterton, Oscar Wilde, Alexander Solzhenitsyn, and Hilaire Belloc. He will speak on the topic, "A Matter of Life and Death: The Battle for a True Education." In an age of radical relativism and secular fundamentalism, the very future of education is under threat. Pearce will unmask the poison of modern education and its anti-Christian agenda. He also reveals the marks of the true education, which counters the culture of death with eternal life-giving verities. Please save the dates, and plan to join us for our final lecture of the season.

Diocesan Services Appeal 2018

Let me first of all say "Thank you" again for your generous response to the Witness to Hope Campaign last year. (Here's a brief update on the Witness to Hope Campaign before I talk about DSA: As I mentioned several months ago, we have some renderings that are beautiful and I look forward to being able to share with the parish. At this point, we are waiting for some initial rough cost estimates for the new proposed renovation of the sanctuary. Hopefully, we will get those estimates this month. When we get that information, we will schedule a town hall meeting to share the renderings and to get feedback from you.)

As you may recall, the Witness to Hope Campaign included the funds that would have been raised by the DSA in 2017. We are conducting DSA 2018 now because the diocese needs to cover ongoing costs of the diocesan staff and services throughout the ten counties of the diocese. This year, our parish DSA goal is \$72,386. I want to acknowledge that I know that many of us are making ongoing payments on our Witness to Hope pledge, and that some of us stretched ourselves to give generously to that appeal. Please know that Bishop Boyea is grateful for your generous support of the diocese, as am I for your support of our efforts here. For those who are able to do so, the bishop invites you/us to prayerfully discern what we might be able to give this year to the DSA. Good Shepherd Sunday

Each year, the fourth Sunday of Easter is "Good Shepherd Sunday," when the Gospel for the day is taken each year from John chapter 10. Jesus is the Good Shepherd who lovingly calls our names. He longs for us to follow Him. He knows us (if we will let Him!) and we know Him. Sometimes we wander, and He, the Good Shepherd lovingly pursues us, calling always our name. Once we come to Him, and open our hearts to receive the Holy Spirit in power, and we follow Him, Jesus reaffirms His commitment to shepherd us. He gives us eternal life. He gives us Eternal Life in this life, by the power of the Holy Spirit. This is not just a promise for after we die, but a promise for today.


Consider now this wonderful promise: Jesus states that no one (nothing, no event, no evil spirit, no person) can take us out of His hand. He then restates the promise, lest we doubt: no one (nothing, no event, no evil spirit, no person) can take us out of the Father's hand. We are safe in the Shepherd's care if we will but remain in His hand. The key is our willingness to remain with Him, to let Jesus our Good Shepherd truly care for us, and to guide us by the Holy Spirit He gave us in our baptism. May the Holy Spirit, the voice of the Good Shepherd guide each of us, and help us by God's grace to never leave the protection of the loving hand of our Lord. Amen.

Each year as we celebrate the Good Shepherd, I am encouraged and sobered by the example of Jesus who has called me and other priests to serve and shepherd His flock. I count being pastor of the Church of the Resurrection among the truly great gifts to me from the Lord. May I have a heart ever more conformed to that of the Good Shepherd, Jesus the High Priest.


