

Why I Rejoice in the Current Crisis

My joy in this sad moment is rooted in Christ, and my conviction, as we heard this past week at Mass, that Christ has committed Himself to purify His Bride, the Church:

Husbands, love your wives, even as Christ loved the church and handed himself over for her to sanctify her, cleansing her by the bath of water with the word, that he might present to himself the church in splendor, without spot or wrinkle or any such thing, that she might be holy and without blemish. (Eph. 5:25-27)

Christ is at work, just here, in this scandalous moment, which reveals, if the account of Archbishop Viganò is to be believed, lies and cronyism at the highest reaches of the hierarchy. I don't know that it is true, but it seems too plausible to be ignored. In fact, now that this has all been said, and so very publicly, it seems obvious to me and to so many faithful Catholics, that the Church must investigate the claims thoroughly in dogged pursuit of the truth. And I am grateful that at least a few bishops have said as much.

As I was praying about the events of the past weeks, I realized more fully why the revelations about Archbishop McCarrick, the Pennsylvania Grand Jury report, and the allegations outlined by Viganò gave me a sense of peace and joy. It is because the one clear thread through all of it is the pernicious effect of the gay lobby/cabal/culture—call it what you will—in the priesthood. The secret that all priests and seminarians knew all too well has come clearly into the light.

A few months ago, when I heard that Fr. James Martin, S.J. had been invited to give a talk at the World Meeting of Families, I, like many priests and lay faithful, was disheartened. And angry. That's because he simply does not think with the Church. I had long-suspected, as many of us have, that Fr. Martin has been propped up by gay-agenda advancing bishops and cardinals. Archbishop Viganò's testimony makes sense of why and how that's happened.

It has long been my sense that there has been an assault on truth during this pontificate, and the ambiguity around moral questions continues to grow. The question many ask is "what's next?" Many fear that the Synod on Youth could serve as another push to "change" or "update" the Church's teaching. It seemed to me, and to many, that the "innovators" had the wind at their backs. But the scandal, thanks be to God, has changed the winds. May the Barque of Peter be righted again and travel safely in the winds of the Holy Spirit. Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and renew the face of the earth!

MISSION APPEAL-2ND COLLECTION DIOCESE OF HO, GHANA

This weekend Fr. Richard D. Affirm is asking Resurrection to support the work of the church in the Diocese of Ho, Ghana. Their mission is to bring the Gospel to the people in their rural diocese by providing school, vocational training centers, hospitals, clinics, village Churches, wells and educational materials to those the government assistance does not reach.

The Ho diocese is located in the Volta Region of Ghana and is one of 20 dioceses in Ghana and has 29 parishes. We are involved with renovating some of our infrastructures in the diocese which have run down with time and pose danger to their occupants.

The Socio-economic life of the people in Ho diocese is very poor. The biggest obstacle is the lack of funds. Ho diocese is basically very rural with few towns and much poverty. While there are some clerical workers in the towns, the principle occupation of the villagers is agriculture, mainly subsistent farming with a good deal of petty trading among the people. More than 70% of the population are involved in this. The population of Ho diocese is 790,000 and the total population of Ghana is 25 mil-

There are no manufacturing industries and no factories. Imagine what it would be like if there was little infrastructure to support the most basic needs of life, if there were no government services or public institutions available for you and your families. Without the Catholic Church providing schools, healthcare, and job training there would be nothing for many of these people.

We will have a second collection this weekend. Please prayerfully consider our donation. Please be as generous as you are able. God Bless You


