Updates on Capital Campaign

Thank you for your generous support of the Witness to Hope Campaign, we completed a year ago. As you have seen, we have initial sketches for a potential renovation of the sanctuary. I met with Bishop Boyea in July, and the architect is working on plans that incorporate Bishop Boyea's recommendations. I hope to be able to share those drawings with you soon, and then to proceed with the next of many steps that are required to get the project under way. After a design is approved, we will get bids, and then have several additional steps for official approval of that, our first project of the two that we had as "case elements" for our capital campaign. The second project, the larger and costlier of the two, is the connection

between the two school buildings. Once we get the sanctuary project past the approval stages, we will begin working with an architect to develop the plans for the connection between the school buildings.

Thank you, Bishop Boyea!

As you know, over the past weeks, I have been preaching often about the ongoing clerical abuse scandal. I have mentioned that I have shared concerns with Bishop Boyea, and have been hoping and praying that he would respond to the scandal in ways that strengthen the relationship between the faithful and him as the Shepherd of our local Church in the Diocese of Lansing. This past Tuesday, he released a letter on the scandal that communicated his plans to have an audit of the priests' files, as well as a comprehensive statement of our current practices and policies, and his commitment to ensure that ministers are living in ways consistent with their promises and commitments to God and to the Church. I am grateful for his letter and his efforts, and I invite us all to continue to pray and fast for the victims, as well as all the faithful in the Church. 


