

A MESSAGE FROM FR. STEVE

Hearts Filled with Joy

On this *Gaudete Sunday*, my heart is filled with joy for God's goodness to us this year. Thank you for your prayerful support of our ministry, and your commitment to spiritual growth, spreading the Gospel, and ministering to those in need. It is a beautiful thing to see the generous outpouring of time, talent, and treasure parishioners have shown, and the openness to the Lord's leading among the faithful of the parish. The Lord has blessed us richly, and I hope and pray that we will continue to grow in our ability to worship God well, grow in holiness, and serve others in love, especially the "least of these" as we enjoy the new year in our Lord's favor.

Basic Introduction to Christian Prayer

Brian Fink will be offering Part III of his three week introduction to Christian Prayer, this Thursday from 7:00 to 8:00 p.m. He is basing his talks on the first part of the Catechism of the Catholic Church. The series will be held in Mercy Hall (127 Rumsey).

Special Rorate Mass December 15th at 7:05 a.m.

After Benediction at 7:00 a.m. Saturday morning, I will offer a special *Rorate Mass* by candlelight in addition to our normal 8:15 a.m. Mass. *The Rorate Caeli Mass is a traditional Advent devotion wherein the Mass of the Blessed Virgin Mary for Advent is offered just before dawn. The interplay of light and darkness speak to the meaning of Advent and the coming of the Light of the world.*

The Mass takes its title, Rorate Caeli, from the first words of the Introit, which are from Isaiah 45:8: "Rorate, caeli, desuper, et nubes pluant justum, aperiatur terra, et germinet Salvatorem." "Drop down dew, ye heavens, from above, and let the clouds rain the just: let the earth be opened and bud forth a Saviour."

The Rorate Mass is lit only by candlelight. Because it is a votive Mass in Mary's honor, white vestments are worn instead of Advent violet. In the dimly lit setting, priests and faithful prepare to honor the Light of the world, Who is soon to be born, and offer praise to God for the gift of Our Lady. As the Mass proceeds and sunrise approaches, the church becomes progressively brighter, illumined by the sun as our Faith is illumined by Christ. The readings and prayers of the Mass foretell the prophecy of the Virgin who would bear a Son called Emmanuel, and call on all to raise the gates of their hearts and their societies to let Christ the King enter; asking for the grace to receive eternal life by the merits of the Incarnation and saving Resurrection of Our Lord.

Lumen Veritatis December 15

Our next *Lumen Veritatis* lecture will be held this Saturday (December 15) at 7:30 in Mercy Hall (127 Rumsey). The evening begins with fellowship at 7:00 p.m., followed by a talk, questions & answers, and more fellowship. This month's *Lumen Veritatis* lecture is entitled, "The Role of

the Supreme Court in Shaping Culture." Our speaker is Fr. Mike Murray, who was a lawyer by trade. He was ordained a permanent deacon in 2005, and served Diocesan Council for Bishops Mengeling and Boyea. He served as Bishop Boyea's Chief of Staff before he was assigned Pastor of St. Martha's in May 2017. I had the privilege of working closely with Fr. Mike at St. Thomas, where he had been assigned, and at the diocese, when I served as Superintendent. I look forward to hearing his (what are always) very sensible observations about, in this case, how courts and culture interplay.

Taize Prayer December 16 at 7:30 p.m.

This Sunday evening after Vespers, which is at 7:00 p.m., we will have an evening of *Taize Prayer*. If you haven't participated in *Taize Prayer* before, I want to very much encourage you to join us next Sunday evening in the church at 7:30 p.m. The church lights will be dimmed, there will be many candles, and the ensemble will lead us in beautiful and simple refrains, some in English, others in Latin. The evening will include some biblical readings as well as times for silent prayer. The evening is very conducive to prayerful preparation of the coming of Jesus.

Christmas Concert

This Wednesday at 6:30 p.m., you are invited to attend the K-5 Christmas Concert, which will be held in the church. It's a time for making a joyful noise.

Communal Penance Service/Confessions

Last week, we were reminded that St. John the Baptist called those who heard him to repentance, which was a way to prepare their hearts to receive Jesus and the Holy Spirit He came to give us. Let us all see this holy season as an invitation from the Lord to prepare a way of the Lord in our own hearts. One way to prepare a way is to make a good confession. This Sunday (12/16) afternoon at 2:00 p.m. at St. Thomas Aquinas and St. Gerard, there will be our Advent Community Communal Penance Service. If this afternoon is not a good time for you, consider making a good confession during one of the opportunities we have regularly here at the Church of the Resurrection for the sacrament of reconciliation. See the bulletin for confession times.

Please note that we will not have a Holy Hour or confessions Friday, December 21st. Adoration that day will conclude with Benediction at 6:00 p.m.

SCHOOL NEWS

A Holy Anticipation During Advent

I gave a talk to all the students during the School's Advent Retreat, and the objective was to help our students take on a holy anticipation during the season of Advent. Yes, they are excited about presents and may feel like Christmas is never going to come. I have heard stories about kids who couldn't sleep on Christmas Eve because they were so excited.

I am not referring to that kind of anticipation of Christmas. My talk focused on how long the people of Israel had been waiting before the Messiah came. We could argue since the Fall of Adam and Eve (??? B.C.) or the Promise to Abraham (2100 B.C.) or Israel's Slavery in Egypt (1850 B.C.) or the Babylonian Exile (500 B.C.) It is hard to say for sure, but we can all agree that the people of God had a long and hard road, 1,000's of years of suffering under foreign rule and the secret hope of a Messiah who would free the people.

This is the holy anticipation of the 1st Advent. However, we are living in the 2nd Advent, the season of waiting for Christ to come again. We don't know how long it will be, but we want to be ready when He comes.

A portion of Israel's holy anticipation is captured in the song O' Come O' Come Emmanuel. I discussed this with the students and shared the most beautiful version of the song I have ever heard. The link is listed below, and I would encourage our families to play this in their homes and let this prayer of an ancient people cover us during this holy season of preparation.


