As it says on our school letter-head, we've been "forming disciples of Christ since 1926." What a great legacy of faith we have! Please pray for Mr. Allstott, our faculty, staff, parents, and students. Be sure of this, our parish's long-standing investment in Resurrection School has born fruit and is bearing good fruit still. Thank you! If you have questions or want to learn more about our school, please call or make a visit. We would love to share what God is doing in our midst.

Because this is Catholic Schools Week, we will be having a morning Mass on Tuesday at 8:15, and a second, Family Mass at 11:00 a.m. on Wednesday. Feel free to join us for any or all of these Masses this week.

Healing Wounds of All Sorts

As I mentioned in my homily last weekend about racism, the insights Dr. Bob Schuchts draws on how we respond to wounds can give tremendous healing, that is, if we are willing to begin by working through the process of forgiveness. It is my sincere belief that the following steps can be as helpful for working through social and racial grievances as with personal grievances. One of the keys to healing and forgiveness is for us is to ask the Lord to illuminate our hearts so that we can really know the areas of our brokenness and resentment, so that we can be open to His healing love. Here's the process for forgiveness and other relevant prayers.

PROCESS OF FORGIVING ANOTHER PERSON

- 1. Ask the Holy Spirit to show you who you need to forgive (could be family, friend, abuser, God, yourself).
- 2. Picture the person in front of you and pay attention to what you feel.
- 3. Make an account of the debt they owe you. (what did they take from you, how did they hurt you? It is okay to feel angry).
- 4. Speak to that person aloud telling them what they did to hurt you and how it has affected you.
- 5. Ask the Holy Spirit to reveal to you what you believe about yourself based on that incident. (the identity lie).
- 6. Renounce the identity lie. (For example: "I renounce the lie that I am not loved or cared for, etc.? See "Prayer for Renouncing Identity Lies.")
- 7. Ask the Holy Spirit to reveal the judgments you hold towards the person who hurt you.
- 8. Renounce the judgments. (See "Prayer for Renouncing Judgments.")
- 9. Pray a short prayer asking Jesus to forgive the person.
- 10. Forgive the person.
- 11. Pray a prayer of blessing over that person, asking God to bless them in the opposite way to the way they hurt you.
- 12. Are there any inner vows you have made as a result of this hurt? Renounce those inner vows now (See "Prayer for Renouncing Inner Vows.")
- 13. Is there an unhealthy soul tie with the person you have just forgiven? Break the soul tie. (See "Prayer for Breaking Soul Ties.")

- 14. Ask Jesus to seal this forgiveness and heal the wounds. (*See "Prayer for Sealing and Blessing."*)
- 15. Thank God for His healing.

PRAYER FOR RENOUNCING INNER VOWS

Father I acknowledge that I have tried to save myself rather than rely on you for my salvation. Please forgive me for my sin of pride and self-sufficiency. I acknowledge that my effort to protect myself has left me imprisoned behind walls that keep me from giving and receiving love. I desire to be free of this bondage that has come as a result of my own choices. In the name of Jesus I renounce the inner vow that I will never (details of inner vow). I ask you to release me from the bondage of this vow now. Amen.

PRAYER FOR RENOUNCING JUDGMENT

Father I acknowledge that I have judged (name). I realize that I did this to protect myself from feelings of vulnerability and powerlessness in order not to be hurt. I also realize that this judgment is sin and keeps me bound. I ask you now for your forgiveness and to release me and (the person judged) from the bondage of this condemnation and isolation. In the name of Jesus I renounce the judgment of (name) that he/she is (identify specific judgments). I know I cannot change my own heart, so I ask you to give me your heart of compassion for (name). Amen.

PRAYER FOR RENOUNCING IDENTITY LIES

In the name of Jesus Christ, I renounce the lie that (examples: "I am alone"; "I am ugly", "Nothing will ever change"; "I am not loved"; "If I trust I will die" etc.). And in Jesus name, and through the power of the Holy Spirit, I ask that you reveal the truth of my identity before the Father, where these identity lies have taken hold in my heart. Amen.

PRAYER FOR SEALING AND BLESSING

Father, I thank you for this healing through the name of Jesus and by the power of your Holy Spirit. I praise you for your great love, mercy and power, and for sending Jesus in the power of the Spirit to heal our broken hearts and to free us from all bondage. I ask now for you to seal this healing and to close any remaining doorways, by the precious blood of Jesus, and the gentle ministry of your Holy Spirit. I pray that you will bless (me or other person) now with a new infilling of your Spirit and with a new understanding and authority of (my/ their) identity in Jesus Christ. Please especially bless (any area of wounding). I acknowledge that I am (re-affirm truths revealed in healing prayer). I thank you and praise you for your graciousness to me. Amen.






