A MESSAGE FROM FR. STEVE

The State of the Parish

Last week, I preached about the "State of the Parish" and want to put in print some of what I said. As I stated, the State of the Parish is strong, and I mean that in every way possible. That is not to say that we don't have areas for growth, because we surely do. But the Lord is doing wonderful things in our midst, and I am profoundly grateful for your response to the Lord's leading, your generous support of our ministry, and your willingness to engage with the life of faith in our parish, school, and other ministries. We are very blessed, and I thank God for you.

As I noted in my homily, we were one of twenty (out of seventy-six) parishes that grew last year. We had a growth of 1.8%, whereas the diocese decreased around 2% in the "October Counts" of Mass attendance. Over the past ten years, the diocese numbers have decreased by 22% and our attendance increased by 21%. Ours is one of only four parishes who increased over the ten-year period. Moreover, our giving is probably around 3% of annual household income, which is much higher than the 1.25% to 1.5% common in most Catholic parishes. Thank you!

Some other highlights of the State of the Parish include the fact that we had six students transfer into our school at the semester. We have ministries for girls and boys in the parish, and offer the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd, which I would love to see grow in coming years. We also offer a wide-range of opportunities for fellowship, growth, prayer, and healing, and I long for us to be able to do more and more, including greater outreach to the "least of these" in our midst. And that is the invitation that I gave to strive to be more intentional in our giving.

Blessed to Be a Blessing!

We are, all of us, blessed by God with gifts. I have said repeatedly that I long for all of us to be able to use the gifts that we've been given for the building up of the Kingdom of God and the salvation of souls. Many of you offer of your time, as well, in many diverse ways of serving the parish and our community. Thank you! Finally, our "treasure" is also what we can offer to support the work of ministry. Your generosity makes possible our ministry; and greater giving will, I believe, translate into greater ministry and greater evangelization and service that allow us to fulfill the corporal and spiritual works of mercy.

Tithing is a Biblical Principle, Which Includes a Promise

Last week in my homily, I referenced the powerful words (and promise) found in Malachi Chapter 3, which outline both the importance of giving God what is due Him, because everything we have is a gift, anyway. God speaks through Malachi, and has, as it were, a conversation with reluctant givers. I hope that this is primarily an encouragement to you, but it might also be a needed prod to consider your giving, even as it challenges me to do the same.

Malachi 3:8 Can anyone rob God? But you are robbing me! And you say, "How have we robbed you?" Of tithes and contributions! 9 You are indeed accursed, for you, the whole nation, rob me. 10 Bring the whole tithe into the storehouse, That there may be food in my house. Put me to the test, says the LORD of hosts, and see if I do not open the floodgates of heaven for you, and pour down upon you blessing without measure! 11 I will rebuke

the locust for you so that it will not destroy your crops, and the vine in the field will not be barren, says the LORD of hosts. 12 All the nations will call you blessed, for you will be a delightful land, says the LORD of hosts.

When we stretch ourselves in faith, God sees us, and is pleased. Let's pray for each other, that we would increase in our trust of God with all that He has entrusted to us!

Tithing (Giving God His Portion)

The principle in Malachi is premised on the obvious truth that God is the source of all we have, and our ability to make money comes from Him. Giving God "His Portion" first is an act of worship, which many of you have already committed to doing. Thank you! Others of you may be able to tithe, but might believe that we are doing well, so there isn't really a need for your financial support. Let me assure you that right now, we can do what we are doing, because of a VERY significant gift each year from one family. Your financial support will help us be less dependent upon that remarkable gift and allow us to do more in terms of ministry to the least of these.

If we were really to become a "stewardship parish," marked by tithing, we would be able to do more ministry and even possibly get to the place where families would not be charged tuition (beyond a relatively modest "co-pay") for school here. We would not charge for other events, either. I would say that the "sky is the limit" of what ministry might be able to do, if we all tithed. (Imagine: We would have an offertory of approximately \$3,000,000, based on an estimated household income of \$50,000 and six hundred families.) Similarly, if the parish averaged 5% of their income, we would have an additional \$500,000 with which to minister. One practical challenge I gave is to those who are presently giving less than \$1500 per year. If they were able to give \$30/week, without any other changes, we would have an additional \$300,000 with which to minister.

Taking the "Generosity Challenge"

In the pews this week and next, you will find a card that I encourage you to pray about, fill out, and put in the offertory or drop it by the office. What I'm inviting us each to do is to look at our giving from this past year, and then pray. After prayer, please make a commitment to an amount that you will give in 2019 in support of our ministry, as a response of faith and obedience to the Lord. Another option would be to fill out the information online. One way to fulfill this commitment is to enroll in online giving, which is the easiest way to ensure that you are fulfilling your commitment. That way, when we are away, the parish continues to receive support.

Again, thanks!

Thanks for your heart and lives of faith, and for your witness to me. I count myself blessed to be your pastor and can't wait to see what God will do in and through our parish in the next ten years.




