



Quotes on Prayer

In my first talk on prayer on March 7th, I quoted from a great book called *The Soul of the Apostolate*, written by Dom Jean-Baptiste Chautard, a Trappist monk. In his book, he makes painfully clear the importance and power of the interior life, and the dangers of neglecting our interior life. These reflections (you can read more on our website where my talk is posted) offer words for reflection for us all in this holy season of Lent. We are called to take more time in prayer during this Holy Season. Prayer is the first, and most important, thing! These words are both encouraging and challenging:

"A short but fervent prayer will usually do more to bring about conversion than long discussions or fine speeches. He who <u>prays</u> is in touch with the FIRST cause. He acts directly upon it. And by that very fact he has his hand upon all the secondary causes, since they only receive their efficiency from this superior principle. And so the desired effect is obtained both more surely and more promptly" (p. 36, emphasis in original).


"The more closely a man unites first his own soul, and then that of another, to God, therefore, the more acceptable is his sacrifice. But this intimate and generous, as well as humble union, can only be effected by prayer. To apply oneself to a life of prayer, or to lead others to give themselves to it, is, therefore, more pleasing to God than to devote oneself to activity and good works, and lead others to practice these" (p. 42, emphasis in original).


