#### A MESSAGE FROM FR. STEVE

#### It's Great to Be Back . . .

My time away was wonderful. Thanks for your prayers. It was very restful, renewing, and a deeper invitation into the beauty and simplicity of God. Taking bike rides, hikes, and spending time in my kayak, along with rest, time for prayer, and good conversations with some Calumet friends and my brother Dan, made my time truly re-creational. Though the weather was perfect, I stayed long enough that I was very happy to return. That's not my life. This is. Thanks for being a great parish for me to serve. It's a joy to be pastor of such a great parish.

#### **Mental Praver**

During my time away, I enjoyed the slow pace of life and the unbounded calendar. The only fixed moment in my days was the Mass at Our Lady of the Pines. But other than that, I was free to pray, read, reflect, and recreate as I pleased. It was an invitation to contemplation of God's goodness and the beauty around me.

# Don't Just Do Something, Sit There.

On vacation, it's easier to take more time for prayer, at least for a priest! For those with young families, it's more of a challenge. But prayer, the sort of contemplative prayer called "mental prayer," is important for all of us. And not just when we're on vacation. I want to encourage all of us to take more time than we think we can afford to prayer. Here's a brief summary written by Sean O'Neill, and a link to my homily:

In this homily, Fr. Steve talks about the importance of daily mental prayer and encourages us to spend an extra 5 minutes per day spending time with God in this way. Many of us do not think we have time to do mental prayer. For much of the time our prayer can tend to focus on petitions, but do we ever spend time opening ourselves to a personal encounter with Him? Fr. Steve shares an experience of his own in which he extended his prayer time and the Lord gave the message, "I covet these times." The Lord wants to spend time with us. Let us take more time than we think we can afford.

Fr. Steve then read an excerpt from a book by the English-born Irish Dominican, Fr. Herbert McCabe:

People often complain of "distractions" during prayer. Their mind goes wandering off onto other things. This is nearly always due to praying for something you do not really much want; you just think it would be proper and respectable and "religious" to want it. So you pray high-mindedly for big but distant things like peace in Northern Ireland or you pray that your aunt will get better from the flu – when in fact you do not much care about these things; perhaps you ought to, but you don't. And so your prayer is rapidly invaded by distractions arising from what you really do want promotion at work, let us say. Distractions are nearly always your real wants breaking in on your prayer for edifying but bogus wants. If you are distracted, trace your distraction back to the real desires it comes from and pray about these. When you are praying for what you really want you will not be distracted. People on sinking ships do not complain of distractions during their prayer. (McCabe, God, Christ, and Us, p. 8).

Often we ask God for things that are not good for us. But as Fr. McCabe notes, when we ask, he either gives us what we ask for, or he gives us something better! God knows our need. Let us persevere in prayer and allow God to give us what we really need, what is really good for us. The audio of that homily can be found at https://corlansing.org/homilies/encounter-god-in-prayer

And here's Sean's summary of my three part series on "mental prayer": In March of this year, Fr. Steve gave a three-part introduction to the Christian discipline of mental/contemplative prayer. He addressed the theology and practice of mental prayer, and gave "homework" for "beginners" (and we're all beginners, says St. Teresa of Avila) as an aid to growing in our ability to open our hearts and minds to the Lord in prayer.
