#### A MESSAGE FROM FR. STEVE

#### **Fifteenth Annual Resurrection School Auction**

This Saturday evening (November 9th) after the 5:00 p.m. Mass, we will gather to celebrate God's goodness to us and to have an evening of fun, fellowship, and fundraising at our 15th Annual School Auction. I'm grateful for all of those who have labored lovingly to prepare for that annual event. In contrast to many school auctions, the cost is minimal to attend. We want this to be a parish event as well as a way to help us raise money to continue to form Disciples of Christ at Resurrection School. Please join us! It's a great time and a great cause.

#### **Annual Report**

At 12:30 today (Sunday), we will review the Annual Report (copies of which are available at the parish office and in the vestibule of the church) in the St. John Paul II Room, (123 Rumsey, the boiler building).

#### **Repeat: Saturday Evening Mass**

Every October, along with every other parish in the diocese, we took a count of all those who attended each Mass. Our total this year was 885, one less than last year's total of 886. I suspect that most other parishes will have seen at least a small decline, so I am pleased by that number. The average attendance for each Mass for the month was as follows: Saturday 5:00 p.m., 143; Sunday 9:00 a.m., 331; Sunday 11:00 a.m., 238; and Sunday 5:30 p.m., 173. Given these numbers and knowing that we will eventually need to eliminate one Mass, after consultation with the Parish Pastoral Council, effective the first Saturday of 2020 (January 4), we will no longer have a Saturday evening Mass. That same weekend we will also change the Mass time for Sunday evening to 5:00 p.m., to accommodate those who prefer the earlier Mass time.

#### **Repeat: Saturday Evenings & Sundays**

Another change that we will implement on January 4, 2020 is shifting Vespers from Sunday evening at 7:00 p.m. to Saturday evening at 5:30 p.m. This change will also allow us to change the monthly (First Sunday) Extraordinary Form Compline to 7:00 p.m. This will allow young families to bring their children to experience that beautiful evening of prayer. On the first Saturday of the month, we will hold Solemn Vespers, which would include a brief homily after the reading, and incensation during the singing of the Magnificat.

#### Warning about Fr. James Martin, S.J.

Last weekend, I preached about concerns I have with the errant teaching of Fr. James Martin, S.J., regarding sexual morality. I invite people to listen to my homily from November 3, if you did not hear it. In the summary on the website, you will find links to several articles, which those interested can review. For now, I want to offer you these comments about Father Martin made by Archbishop Chaput, which I quoted at most of the Masses: Father Martin — no doubt unintentionally — inspires hope that the Church's teachings on human sexuality can be changed. In his book, Building A Bridge, he writes:

"For a teaching to be really authoritative it is expected that it will be received by the people of God ... From what I can tell, in the LGBT community, the teaching that LGBT people must be celibate their entire lives ... has not been received." [vi] One might easily, and falsely, infer from such language that the Church's teaching on sexual intimacy lacks binding authority for same-sex attracted Catholics.

Again to his credit, Father Martin has stressed that, "as a Catholic priest, I have ... never challenged [the Church's] teachings, nor will I." [vii] But what is implied or omitted often speaks as loudly as what is actually stated, and in the current climate, incomplete truths do, in fact, present a challenge to faithful Catholic belief.

When people hear that "the Church welcomes gay people" or needs to be more "inclusive and welcoming" without also hearing the conditions of an authentically Christian life set for all persons by Jesus Christ and his Church—namely, living a life of chastity—they can easily misunderstand the nature of Christian conversion and discipleship.

For this reason, Catholic teaching always requires more than polite affirmation or pro forma agreement, particularly from those who comment publicly on matters of doctrine. Faithful Catholics who are same-sex attracted need support and encouragement in the virtue of chastity. They deserve to hear — as all people do — the truth about human sexuality spoken clearly and confidently. Anything less lacks both mercy and justice. In its 1986 Letter, the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith warned us, This Congregation wishes to ask the Bishops to be especially cautious of any programs which may seek to pressure the Church to change her teaching, even while claiming not to do so. A careful examination of their public statements and the activities they promote reveals a studied ambiguity by which they attempt to mislead the pastors and the faithful.

Supporters of Father Martin's efforts will note, correctly, that several Church leaders have endorsed his work. Those Churchmen are responsible for their words — as I am for mine, as pastor of the Church in Philadelphia. And specifically in that role as pastor, I want to extend the CDF's caution to all the faithful of the Church in Philadelphia, regarding the ambiguity about same-sex related issues found throughout the statements and activities of Father James Martin.

I share the archbishop's concerns, and want to add my pastoral warning for all those who attend the Church of the Resurrection. May we be truly loving and give all the faithful the truth, that Jesus tells us can and will "set us free."
