Called to be Martyrs (Witnesses)

Last weekend, I preached about the powerful account given in II Maccabees 7 of the mother and her seven sons, who all died for their Jewish faith. They were martyrs for the faith, who shed their blood for love of God. Each of us is also called to be a martyr (or "witness") to the faith in our world. As I mentioned last week, we are all going to face the choice of standing for the truth that we find in our faith or remaining silent in the face of increasing hostility to the faith. Bearing testimony, always lovingly, and with clarity, is what we are called to do in every time and in every circumstance. To do so, of course, we must know the truth that we have in Christ, and discern how best to communicate the truth whenever lies of the evil one or of the world are being promoted or pushed. Bearing witness to the truth might mean that we will be rejected by those around us. Like the saints and martyrs who have gone before us, and who are praying non-stop for us, we need to be prepared for the response of those who reject the truth. We need to be willing to this might mean being ridiculed for being "backward," "politically incorrect," "rigid" or "petrified." All of us can imagine that, if we stand for the truth today, we could easily be called "haters" "bigots," "sexist," "homophobic," or "transphobic." We might even find that our family members will reject us or criticize us. But, do not be afraid, nor surprised. We need to keep loving them. And pleasing the Lord.

Jesus Told Us So

While those particular epithets didn't exist in the First Century, believers have historically been persecuted. Jesus warns us about persecution in our gospel this weekend: "You will even be handed over by parents, brothers, relatives, and friends, and they will put some of you to death. You will be hated by all because of my name, but not a hair on your head will be destroyed. By your perseverance you will secure your lives" (Luke 21:16-19). Let us, indeed, be among those who support each other in the life and defense of faith, and truly love God with our whole heart, soul, mind, and strength, and our neighbors as ourselves. This is our time to be witnesses. To be martyrs. Come, Holy Spirit!




