We hope that this message will encourage you, if you are able at this time, to pray for and donate toward our longstanding, core mission groups. All funds collected will be combined and divided equally among these groups. ### Forgiveness Is Non-Optional

Last weekend, I felt inspired to preach strongly about the necessity of forgiveness. Not seven times, but seventy-seven (or seventy times seven) times, which basically means, every time! I am very grateful for the Book of Sirach, even though it challenges me. Let me invite all of us to meditate on this powerful word once again, and move beyond anger and rage to mercy and forgiveness:

Wrath and anger are hateful things, yet the sinner hugs them tight. The vengeful will suffer the LORD's vengeance, for he remembers their sins in detail. Forgive your neighbor's injustice; then when you pray, your own sins will be forgiven. Could anyone nourish anger against another and expect healing from the LORD? Could anyone refuse mercy to another like himself, can he seek pardon for his own sins? If one who is but flesh cherishes wrath, who will forgive his sins? Remember your last days, set enmity aside; remember death and decay, and cease from sin! Think of the commandments, hate not your neighbor; remember the Most High's covenant, and overlook faults. Let's be among those who "cease from sin" and extend mercy and forgiveness to one another.

This month will see the relics of Padre Pio tour the Diocese of Lansing for public veneration (September 19 - 25). This includes a visit by the relics to Saint Mary Cathedral in Lansing upon the Feast of Saint Pio, September 23.
