#### Challenges of "attending Mass" in Mercy Hall Since Pentecost, we have worked well together to

accommodate the numbers who desire to attend Mass, with some of you attending Mass in the church and others in the hall. Obviously enough, it is less than ideal to have a third of those who "attend Mass" do so in Mercy Hall. Though I am grateful that we have been able to have the tabernacle present in Mercy Hall to make it less like watching Mass on TV at home, it is clearly not the same as being present for the Mass. I've been praying and talking with others about how to remedy this situation.

#### **Upcoming Changes to Mass Times/Locations**

After prayer and consultation, I have decided to make the following changes, effective October 18, 2020. All of these changes presume that no-one will attend in the hall.

- Saturday 5:00 Mass will be in the church for "atrisk" only.
- Sunday Masses will be 8:00 a.m., 9:30 a.m., and 11:30 a.m.

The 8:00 a.m. Mass will be a "brief Mass," which means that we will use brief antiphons, no incense, have a brief(er) homily, and use a short Eucharistic Prayer. Ideally, I hope to be finished by 8:45 or so. This should allow for some fellowship (and C&D) afterward, prior to the 9:30 Mass. If you typically attend the 9:00 a.m. Mass, please prayerfully consider shifting to this earlier Mass. If that happens, we will be able to make this work for all of us.

What about Wednesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays? Because we will be eliminating the "oratory" in Mercy

Hall effective October 18, we will offer a "parishioner Mass" at 7:30 a.m. on the three school Mass days, beginning October 21. On Wednesdays through Fridays when school is in session, the Rosary will be prayed at 7:00 a.m. in the church, prior to the start of Mass. The school students and staff will attend the normal 8:15 a.m. W, Th, and F Mass on school days. Note that when school is not in session, we will only have the 8:15 a.m. Mass, as usual.

#### Change Is Hard!

All of us know that change is hard, and during this year, change seems to be the only thing that is constant. (Come, Holy Spirit!) These changes to Mass times will be a challenge for many, but I pray that these adjustments will help us encounter Jesus more fully, and also foster a restore opportunities for fellowship as a community as much as possible. If you would, please pray for me and all leaders, civil and religious. And let us pray for each other. May each of us be gracious and merciful in these trying times.

This coming Saturday evening (October 10th), we will have a time of praise, worship, prayer, adoration, and confession from 7:00 to 8:30 p.m. in the church. It's a great opportunity to worship God and to open our hearts to have Him do healing work in us. Come, and bring others with you. Come, and invite someone to join you.
