#### The Epiphany of the Lord

Today, we celebrate the Epiphany of the Lord, which means "to manifest" or "to show". We remember the visitation by the Magi (Three Wise Men) from the East who came to adore the Newborn King of the Jews. It is on this day that we celebrate the revelation of Jesus the Messiah to the Gentiles. As Gentile believers, we are invited again to celebrate God's gracious manifestation to us. In Christ, God draws all nations into His family of love and grace.

#### On Retreat and Some Vacation

I will be away, beginning Sunday the 3<sup>rd</sup> through Thursday, January 14<sup>th</sup>. Most of the liturgies have coverage, though I still do not have coverage for confessions Friday evening, January 8<sup>th</sup>. We will have adoration through the day and then simple reposition at 8:00 p.m.

#### Confessions While I'm Gone

Please note that there will not be the regular morning confessions Wednesday (6<sup>a</sup> and 13<sup>a</sup>), Thursday (7<sup>a</sup> and 14<sup>a</sup>) or Friday (the 8<sup>a</sup>) while I am gone. Confessions Friday evening (8<sup>a</sup>) may also be canceled, since I have not yet been able to get a priest to cover that time slot. I'm sorry for any inconvenience this will cause. We will place a note on the door and the confessional with this information.

#### Quote from Pope Benedict XVI

Last weekend at some of the Masses, I included this quote from Pope Benedict's *Jesus of Nazareth: The Infancy Narratives*, where he addresses the prophecy of Simeon. I offer his insights for your reflection.

We are not talking about the past here. We all know to what extent Christ remains a sign of contradiction today, a contradiction that in the final analysis is directed at God. God himself is constantly regarded as a limitation placed on our freedom, that must be set aside if man is ever to be completely himself. God, with his truth, stands in opposition to man's manifold lies, his self-seeking and his pride. God is love. But love can also be hated when it challenges us to transcend ourselves. It is not a romantic "good feeling." Redemption is not "wellness," it is not about basking in self-indulgence; on the contrary it is a liberation from imprisonment in self-absorption. This liberation comes at a price: the anguish of the Cross. The prophecy of light and that of the Cross belong together.

#### **Epiphany Home Blessing**

Because I assume most families have holy water, we won't have a supply of water bottles this year, but we will have blessed chalk this year for use to bless your homes with the blessing we've included on the Epiphany in prior years. You can replenish your supply of holy water from the font in the southeast corner of the church.

Description of the Rite of Blessing:

This ceremony of the blessing of the home and inscription of the initials of the three Magi above each door can be performed either by a priest or the father/head of the family. This is from the book <u>The Twelve Days of Christmas</u> by Elsa Chaney. The feast of manifestation, or Epiphany, is traditionally celebrated the 12th day after Christmas, January 6th. In the dioceses of the United States this feast has been moved to the

Prayer:

On entering the home,

Leader (Head of the family): Peace be to this house.

All: And to all who dwell herein.

All: From the east came the Magi to Bethlehem to adore the Lord; and opening their treasures they offered precious gifts: gold for the great King, incense for the true God, and myrrh in symbol of His burial.

All Pray: The Magnificat (During the Magnificat, the room is sprinkled with holy water.)

My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord, my spirit rejoices in God my Savior for he has looked with favor on his lowly servant. From this day all generations will call me blessed: the Almighty has done great things for me, and holy is his Name.

He has mercy on those who fear him in every generation.

He has shown the strength of his arm, he has scattered the proud in their conceit. He has cast down the mighty from their thrones, and has lifted up the lowly. He has filled the hungry with good things, and the rich he has sent away empty. He has come to the help of his servant Israel for he has remembered his promise of mercy,

the promise he made to our fathers, to Abraham and his children for ever.

All: From the east came the Magi to Bethlehem to adore the Lord; and opening their treasures they offered precious gifts: gold for the great King, incense for the true God, and myrrh in symbol of His burial.

Leader: Our Father. . . And lead us not into temptation

All: But deliver us from evil.

Leader: All they from Saba shall come **All: Bringing gold and frankincense.** Leader: O Lord, hear my prayer.

All: And let my cry come to You.

Leader: Let us pray. O God, who by the guidance of a star didst on this day manifest Thine only-begotten Son to the Gentiles, mercifully grant that we who know Thee by faith may also attain the vision of Thy glorious majesty. Through Christ our Lord. **All: Amen.** 

Leader: Be enlightened, be enlightened, O Jerusalem, for thy light is come, and the glory of the Lord is risen upon thee—Jesus Christ born of the Virgin Mary.

All: And the Gentiles shall walk in thy light and kings in the splendor of thy rising, and the glory of the Lord has risen upon thee.

Leader: Let us pray. Bless, + O Lord God almighty, this home, that in it there may be health, purity, the strength of victory, humility, goodness and mercy, the fulfillment of Thy law, the thanksgiving to God the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit. And may this blessing remain upon this home and upon all who dwell herein. Through Christ our Lord.

All: Amen.

After the prayers of the blessing are recited, each room of the home is sprinkled with Epiphany water. The initials of the Magi are inscribed above the main entrance with the blessed chalk. (The initials of the three magi, C for Caspar, M for Melchior, B for Balthasar, can also be interpreted as the Latin phrase "Christus mansionem benedicat" which means "Christ bless this house".)

*Example:* 20 + C + M + B + 21 (20 . . . 21 indicates the year.)


Check in is 6:00pm Friday evening, and the retreat ends after lunch on Sunday.
