As I've mentioned in recent months, we are looking forward to several book/pastoral letter studies that will be held on Thursday evenings in Mercy Hall during the Lent and Easter Seasons. Our plan is to get things set to begin with one of the studies the last week of February. The others will follow on subsequent Thursdays. USCCB's Pastoral Letter "Open Wide Our Hearts: The Enduring Call to Love" (Study Guide for "Open Wide Our Hearts")

**Loved As I Am** (for women only) by Sr. Miriam James Heidland

# The 3 Big Questions for a Frantic Family by Patrick Lencioni

[Please note that we will be delaying the study group for Ralph Martin's book for the time being, so we could include some other titles that we believed might be of interest to more parishioners and members of the community.]

Format for the Mercy Hall Book Study Evenings

Our hope is that those who plan to be part of these conversations about the books/pastoral letter will have read the entire book or pastoral letter prior to the first session. The reason for this is that we don't plan to go sequentially through the books, chapter by chapter, but will take time each of three weeks to discuss major themes together as a large group. The facilitators for the discussion will send out anticipated discussion questions prior to the meetings, which will help frame the discussion.

### Interested in running a study on your own?

Of course, some of you may wish to go chapter by chapter through the book(s) and/or pastoral letter, and I can understand the appeal of that approach. Feel free to establish studies on your own. Just one recommendation: If you plan to lead a study of these or other books, please be wise about how you do so, and get the game plan for discussion set at the start, because, as you know, these conversations can be quite challenging. Whether in the large group studies or in small group studies, let's be sure to reflect Christian virtues, including humility and charity, as we conduct these conversations. One more note: small group "leaders" should be quite familiar with the books, and be intentional about not playing the role of the "expert" but rather serve the group as a facilitator for honest engagement with the ideas conveyed in the book/letter.

### Men's Breakfast

Because of the recent changes to the requirements for food establishments, Men's breakfasts have returned. Hopefully, we will be able to offer a simple bagel and coffee breakfast and fellowship after that in Mercy Hall. The plan at this point is to work through Rod Dreher's book, using the study guide that he created, and which is linked on our website.

### **Healing Hearts**

In today's Gospel, we recall the healing work that Jesus did, and recounts how the people longed to be healed and were looking to him and for him to be healed. The Lord today gives us to the world, to be agents and instruments of healing. I love the fact that the Church gives us Psalm 147 for today's Psalm. Consider these beautiful words:

He heals the brokenhearted and binds up their wounds. He tells the number of the stars;

he calls each by name.

R. Praise the Lord, who heals the brokenhearted. May we each come to know the healing power of the Lord, that we can help others be healed, as well.

### Come Encounter Jesus

This coming Saturday (February 13), we have our next Healing Encounter. It is a time of praise, worship, prayer, and adoration from 7:00 to 8:30 p.m. in the church. The focus this month will be hope. It's a great opportunity to worship God and to open our hearts to have Him do healing work in us. We will also stream the service, as we have been doing regularly of late. Come, and bring others with you. Prayer teams will be available in separate rooms with "distancing" to allow people to receive prayer for healing and other requests. Come, and invite someone to join you. May we be a parish that experiences healing and offers healing opportunities to our friends, neighbors, and family members.



THE GOSPEL OF LIFE @ 25:

Just over a quarter of a century ago, Pope Saint John Paul II released his prophetic encyclical, Evangelium vitae, in response to the ever-increasing attacks against human life and dignity.

Over the next 12 months, we will be releasing a weekly teaching or reflection on this important encyclical so that the faithful may grow in their understanding of the Church's teaching on matters of life and human dignity. We hope you will join us on this journey of life.

Evangelium vitae, translated in English to "The Gospel of Life", was promulgated in Rome on 25 March 1995 by Pope John Paul II. It deals with issues pertaining to the sanctity of human life, including murder, abortion, euthanasia, and capital punishment, reaffirming the Church's timeless teachings on those issues in a way that is relevant to this day.

The document gave greater foundation and focus to what a "Culture of Life" should look like and, by contrast, greater understanding as to what underpins the contemporary "Culture of Death" which continues to hold sway over much of the western world.

The United States' Conference of Catholic Bishops had designated 2020 as the year to begin celebrating the 25th anniversary of Evangelium vitae but, as with many things, COVID-19 got in the way. Hence the beginning of this new series, introduced upon this Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children, January 22, 2021. Next installment? Next week. Until then, God bless you.
