#### Holiest of Weeks . . .

Today, we recall Christ's triumphal entry into Jerusalem. We honor Jesus too, waiving our own palms of victorious celebration, with the poignant awareness of what Jesus came to Jerusalem to do for us—die! And then, Praised be Jesus Christ, rise again. This entire week is one long meditation on love and discipleship. Give yourself, your family, your friends a great gift and join us as often as possible. Holy Week is a great gift to us, and we are exceedingly blessed as we spend time in prayer and gratitude this week.

#### Sacred Triduum

This Thursday, we again begin the "Sacred Triduum," or the Holy Three Days. Note that there are no Masses Thursday, Friday, or Saturday mornings, because the Sacred Triduum forms a great liturgical whole. During the day on Thursday, my brother priests and I will gather with the bishop in Lansing for the blessing of the Holy Oils and for the renewal of our priestly vows. In the evening, we will celebrate the institution of the Eucharist and priesthood at the Mass of the Lord's Supper at 6:30 p.m.

#### **Eucharistic Procession to the Altar of Repose**

After communion that evening, we will process with the Blessed Sacrament to the Altar of Repose, which will be in the parish hall, where the faithful are invited to spend time with Jesus (ending at 11:00 p.m.). Note that adoration will be available Friday morning from 8:30 a.m. until 11:30 at the Altar of Repose (again, in the parish hall).

#### Good Friday of the Lord's Passion

On Friday, there will be many opportunities to pray together. The Church's liturgy of the Lord's Passion will be held at 12:10 p.m. That day, for the second time in a week, we will recall together the Passion of Our Lord Jesus Christ. We will also pray for our needs and the needs of the world, in the context of Christ's love poured out. We will then venerate the wood of the cross and receive communion. At 3:00 p.m., we will gather again to pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet at the "hour of mercy." Finally, in the evening, we will pray the Stations of the Cross at 6:30 p.m.

#### Holy Saturday Night: The Easter Vigil

We spend the day on Holy Saturday in quiet silence and prayer on Saturday as we recall Christ lying in the tomb for us. That evening, we celebrate the Easter Vigil, which is the greatest Solemnity of the liturgical year. We will gather outside at dark, and begin the Solemn Vigil at 8:30 p.m. We will begin with the lighting of the fire that represents Christ's triumph

over death, and then process into the church, following the Paschal Candle. Christ is our Light, and we are enlightened by Him. If you have not attended an Easter Vigil, plan to come. It is a glorious celebration of the love of God and the power of Christ (and those baptized into Christ) over death. Come, let us worship!

#### **Easter Sunday: The Resurrection of the Lord**

Easter Sunday we will have two Masses at the usual times: 8:00 a.m., 9:30 a.m., and 11:30 a.m. It will be a jubilant time of celebration of our Hope in Christ. Plan to come, and invite your friends and family to join you as we celebrate the great gift that death could not keep Him down.

#### **Livestream News**

Please note that we are now (typically) using Vimeo for our livestream rather than YouTube. You can access it from our website "livestream" page, which is accessible from the main page. Please let others know that the YouTube channel is no longer being used for livestreaming NEW events. If you are hoping to watch the livestream at the time of the Mass, you will see it appear on our main livestream page when it is streaming. If you want to watch a livestream that has already ended, you will need to look for it under a heading of collected past livestreams. The one you would check this weekend says "March (2021) Masses." Next week, all Masses for the month will be under "April (2021) Masses." The YouTube page has all the older Masses archived.

#### Being an "Inviting Parish"

As I mentioned last week, one of my desires for the Church of the Resurrection is that we will become more and more comfortable sharing our faith with family and friends, in non-judgmental, winsome ways. Indeed, it's not obvious (or easy) to share the faith, but it all begins with prayerfulness. Do you have family or friends who don't practice their faith, are dealing with serious challenges, seem to be frustrated with life, or are seeking for the answers to the meaning of life? If so, the first step is praying for them. Ask the Lord for a sense of peace about inviting them to join you during Holy Week, or at some occasion during the season of Easter. As we enter into Holy Week, let's keep each other in prayer, as well as those that the Lord is placing on our hearts this Lent and Easter. God bless you all.

There is no sin too great to receive the Mercy of God ~ as long as you repent! #### **Padre Pio Statue**

The Church of the Resurrection will be hosting a life-size statue of Young St. Pio that is making a one-time tour of churches in the region before being installed on Catholic Healthcare International's Casa USA campus in Howell, MI, where he will remain permanently to greet devoted pilgrims & his spiritual children. The one of a kind statue is based on one of the few photos of St. Pio when he was younger. On September 7th, 1910, in the first year of his ministry, Young Padre Pio received the first stigmata while sitting beneath a magnificent tree in Piana Romana, Italy. St. Pio shared the experience in a letter to his spiritual advisor, "In the center of my hands, a red spot appeared, about the size of a coin, and with it, an intense pain in the soles of my feet."

This pain in his hands and feet was the first occurrence of the stigmata, even though they were not visible at the time. It was not until September 20, 1918, that Padre Pio received the visible stigmata after he celebrated morning Mass.

Visiting this statue is to be a part of the history of the pilgrim site coming to Howell, MI where he will be placed under a magnificent tree near the planned Adoration Chapel, a replica of St. Pio's chapel in San Giovanni Rotondo.
