Happy Mother's Day!

This weekend, we honor and give God thanks for our mothers. May our Lord pour out His grace and blessing on all mothers (including, of course, grandmothers, godmothers and spiritual mothers) in a special way. May all mothers feel the pleasure God takes in them. And may all of us know the great gift we've been given by having a perfect mother in heaven, Our Blessed Mother. Mary was given to us as our Mother by Jesus from the Cross. Like all good mothers, she never ceases praying for us . . . "now and at the hour of our death." It is well for us to remember her with love this month.

Resurrection School Super Raffle and Class Project Auction

This fun event will be held May 22nd 6:00-8:00 pm (drawing is at 7:30). As you all know we had to cancel our annual school auction this past fall. We will be holding a super raffle in place of the auction. Tickets are \$100 each for a chance to win \$10,000! Other prizes range from \$500 to \$2,000. Only 500 tickets will be sold. (If fewer than 251 tickets sold the raffle will revert to a single 50/50 prize.) Each class has also made a project for the live auction. The tickets are available online now. They for sale at the parish office, and after each Sunday Mass in Mercy Hall.

Ending of the Mass Dispensation

In a few weeks, on the Solemnity of Pentecost, the dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass will expire. Bishop Boyea has penned some reflections on this, which I invite you to review:

SUNDAY OBLIGATION—SOLEMNITY OF PENTECOST 2021

The first precept of the Church is "You shall attend Mass on Sundays and holy days of obligation and rest from servile labor" (Catechism #2042; see Canon 1247). This is a call for us to sanctify the Lord's Day by worshiping God in the Christian assembly and by resting "from those works and activities which could impede such a sanctification of these days" (Catechism #2042). This is a serious responsibility on the part of all the Faithful People of God "unless excused for a serious reason (for example, illness, the care of infants) or dispensed by their own pastor" (Catechism #2181; see Canon #1245). Obviously, if it is impossible to fulfill this obligation, then it is not binding. When in doubt, speak with your pastor.

It seems to me that a large majority of parishioners have made their return to regular Mass attendance, and I want to encourage everyone to do so on a regular basis, as one is able. As Bishop Boyea says here, this is in keeping with the expectation that we gather together weekly to worship the Lord. Some of you remain quite concerned about the virus. If that's the case for you, I am happy to continue to extend such a dispensation to you (let me know). If anyone is sick or caring for the sick, of course, he

or she doesn't need to let me know. The Lord sees the heart of those who are serving in that way, and there is no obligation. Even when that is the case, however, it is important to set apart time on Sundays for prayer and rest in the Lord.

Plans for Return

As we anticipate this return, I think it prudent to encourage people to wear masks, though, as I have said repeatedly, we will not require mask-wearing. Please note that I will continue the current Mass schedule through the end of (at least) July. On the Solemnity of Pentecost, we will no longer have the color-coded pews. Even so, to the extent possible, we ask people to "distance" from each other. I don't know what the best solution is for those who remain quite concerned about the possible spread of the virus. One option would be consider attending the 5:00 p.m. Saturday anticipatory Mass, which is the least well-attended of our four Masses. The 9:30, as most of us are aware, is the most well-attended of our Masses. The second least well-attended Mass is the 8:00 a.m. Mass.

Our Lady Undoer of Knots

On this Mother's Day, I think it is a good time to remind everyone of the great gift that we have in Mary, who never ceases praying for us. A devotion to which I have grown fond is called the "Our Lady, Undoer of Knots." The roots of the devotion stem from early Patristic imagery that reflected on Mary's healing answer to the effects of the sin of our first mother, Eve. St. Irenaeus writes, "The knot of Eve's disobedience was loosed by the obedience of Mary. For what the virgin Eve had bound fast through unbelief, this did the virgin Mary set free through faith." In a special way, Our Lady Undoer of Knots is invoked a help for wounded relationships, especially marriage relationships. Please prayerfully consider praying this Novena with your particular petition.

Virgin Mary, Mother of fair love, Mother who never refuses to come to the aid of a child in need, Mother whose hands never cease to serve your beloved children because they are moved by the divine love and immense mercy that exists in your heart, cast your compassionate eyes upon me and see the snarl of knots that exist in my life. You know very well how desperate I am, my pain, and how I am bound by these knots. Mary, Mother to whom God entrusted the undoing of the knots in the lives of His children, I entrust into your hands the ribbon of my life. No one, not even the Evil One himself, can take it away from your precious care. In your hands there is no knot that cannot be undone. Powerful Mother, by your grace and intercessory power with Your Son and My Liberator, Jesus, take into your hands today this knot. (mention your petition here)

I beg you to undo it for the glory of God, once for all. You are my hope. O my Lady, you are the only consolation God gives me, the fortification of my feeble strength, the enrichment of my destitution, and, with Christ, the freedom from my chains. Hear my plea. Keep me, guide me, protect me, O safe refuge!

An email has been received from Campus Grounds Manager Chris Spalding to have the Knights help maintain the property grounds until the Fall Season.


