Realigning Resources for Mission

This past week, the priests of the diocese gathered with Bishop Boyea and members of the Realigning Resources for Mission (RRM) Committee to discuss proposed groupings of parishes, which the committee believes would help us all (throughout the entire diocese) more effectively form missionary disciples, to fulfill the Great Commission, and the bishop's vision for a healthy parish, which has been characterized as follows.

A healthy parish in the Diocese of Lansing:

- is led by priests striving for health and holiness
- equips and empowers parish staff
- makes and forms missionary disciples and seeks the lost and serves the poor.

The next steps for the work of the RRM Committee include reviewing feedback from the priests on the proposed "parish groupings," consulting more with Bishop Boyea, and then sharing the proposed groupings with the faithful of the diocese of Lansing by region. The work of the RRM Committee has taken seriously the serious challenges of implementing the cultural and structural changes required by the vision we have for our diocese. I am both hopeful and confident that the changes we contemplate can help us more effectively spread the good news and make disciples "of all nations," as Jesus commissioned us to do. Please pray for the priests, staffs of parishes and schools throughout the diocese, as well as all the faithful, as we anticipate these changes. The process of implementation will be ongoing, and will take into account the lessons of "early adopters" across the diocese, who could begin as soon as a year from now. My hope and prayer is that all of us-priests, staff, and lay faithful-will be open to this move of the Holy Spirit in our midst. Indeed, let us all keep praying, "Come, Holy Spirit!" We will have many opportunities to talk more about this, and I invite you to sign up for the weekly emails from the diocese, which include updates on the RRM process.

Call to Evangelize

In recent weeks, I've had occasion to encourage you all to share through word and witness your faith with others. It's something that many of us are uncomfortable doing, and we want to help you learn ways to share your faith, as I mentioned last weekend, in simple ways, like mentioning things that you're doing because of your faith, and stopping and praying with people when you know they have a need. In past weeks and over the years, I've mentioned the great apostolic exhortation *Evangelii Nuntiandi (On Evangelization in the Modern World)*, which was written by Pope St. Paul VI in 1975. Here are some relevant quotes from the document, which highlight the importance of evangelization:

13. Those who sincerely accept the Good News, through the power of this acceptance and of shared faith therefore gather together in Jesus' name in order to seek together the kingdom, build it up and live it. They make up a community which is in its turn evangelizing. The command to the Twelve to go out and proclaim the Good News is also valid for all Christians, though in a different way Those who have received the Good News and who have been gathered by it into the community of salvation can and must communicate and spread it. 14. The Church knows this. She has a vivid awareness of the fact that the Savior's words, "I must proclaim the Good News of the kingdom of God,"[34] apply in all truth to herself.... It is with joy and consolation that at the end of the great Assembly of 1974 we heard these illuminating words:

We wish to confirm once more that the task of evangelizing all people constitutes the essential mission of the Church."[36] It is a task and mission which the vast and profound changes of present-day society make all the more urgent. Evangelizing is in fact the grace and vocation proper to the Church, her deepest identity. She exists in order to evangelize, that is to say, in order to preach and teach, to be the channel of the gift of grace, to reconcile sinners with God, and to perpetuate Christ's sacrifice in the Mass, which is the memorial of His death and glorious resurrection.

15. Anyone who rereads in the New Testament the origins of the Church, follows her history step by step and watches her live and act, sees that she is linked to evangelization in her most intimate being:

The Church is born of the evangelizing activity of Jesus and the Twelve. She is the normal, desired, most immediate and most visible fruit of this activity: "Go, therefore, make disciples of all the nations."[37] [I]t is above all His mission and His condition of being an evangelizer that she is called upon to continue.[39] For the Christian community is never closed in upon itself. The intimate life of this community - the life of listening to the Word and the apostles' teaching, charity lived in a fraternal way, the sharing of bread[40] this intimate life only acquires its full meaning when it becomes a witness, when it evokes admiration and conversion, and when it becomes the preaching and proclamation of the Good News. Thus it is the whole Church that receives the mission to evangelize, and the work of each individual member is important for the whole.

- The Church is an evangelizer, but she begins by being evangelized herself. She is the community of believers, the community of hope lived and communicated, the community of brotherly love, and she needs to listen unceasingly to what she must believe, to her reasons for hoping, to the new commandment of love.

May we, here at the Church of the Resurrection, and throughout our entire diocese, become more effective in evangelization and disciple-making for our own sake and the sake of our community and world.




Enrollment at LCHS
