

#### **Greetings from God's Country**

I'm writing this from the farthest north state campground in the state of Michigan, Fort Wilkins in Copper Harbor. Once again, it has been a tremendous grace to be here in these northern lands, despite the sweltering heat that found its way this far north. Thankfully, the heat broke on Monday night, and now it's quite cool (54 degrees) in the morning on Wednesday. It's been wonderful sleeping weather the last couple of nights, with crystal clear night skies filled with the glory of the night sky. The beauty and solitude of this place is, as always, very renewing for me. I thank God for this sliver of "Pure Michigan."

## Daily Mass at Our Lady of the Pines

Each morning, I've been privileged to celebrate Mass at a small chapel in Copper Harbor. I can't imagine how many Masses have been celebrated here over hundred plus years that this chapel has been here. This morning (Wednesday), I offered Mass for the intentions of Fr. Joseph McGill, nephew of Sean and Liz O'Neill, who was ordained a priest of Jesus Christ for the Diocese of Paisley in Scotland, just outsider of Glasgow. His ordination was the occasion for my planned trip to Scotland with the O'Neills. They were privileged to attend the ordination and to travel to the Scottish Highlands with family for some well-deserved rest. I know it was a great gift for them to be able to be present for the ordination and Fr. McGill's first Mass of Thanksgiving.

#### **Tech-Free Time**

One of the other graces of being in Copper Harbor is to be cell phone free. In a few locations (on top of Brockway Mountain Drive, for example), one can get a cellular signal, but the blessed "No Service" is what I usually see when I'm up here, and I know the joy of being wonderfully disconnected from the tether of our times.

#### **Holy Protection Byzantine Monastery**

Last Saturday evening, my brother suggested that we join in Solemn Vespers at the Holy Protection Byzantine (Catholic) Monastery near Eagle Harbor, Michigan. You may have enjoyed stopping in at their little shop called the "Jam Pot." They sell jams, breads, cookies, and other goodies to support their common life together. I've enjoyed stopping by every time I come along M-26 heading the scenic way to Copper Harbor. That stretch of M-26 is among the most beautiful drives in Michigan, in my

opinion. I was very grateful for the suggestion from my brother that we go, because the Solemn Vespers of the Byzantine Rite is remarkably rich, deeply delving into the mystery of the Incarnation, and the journey of Jesus to the abode of the dead to draw our forebears out of Hades, thanks, as repeated often, to the gift of the faith and obedience of the Theotokos, the Mother of God, our Mother Mary. Very rich was the diversity of hymns and meditations that filled the seventy-five minutes or so of the Vespers. It is definitely worth your time should you be present on a Saturday evening at 5:30.

#### **Blessed Coincidence (Providence)**

As my brother Dan and I walked in, the other three guests who were present for Vespers were Jennifer, John (Jr,.), and Therese Madigan. What a pleasant surprise it was to see them there. Just after we sat down, Laura Schramm and her boyfriend came in, as well. Laura is working up here at some parishes, and enjoys the Eastern Liturgy, and the presence of two more "Resurrection-connected" Catholics was a great surprise and encouragement to me. The seven guests who were present that evening had connections to Resurrection. Fr. Basil was edified by our conversation afterward, and reminded us how small the "Catholic world" is, both East and West. Both small and as big as the world.

#### Taking Time to Eat, Drink, and Converse

John Madigan, who directs the Catholic Foundation for our diocese, had sent me a text earlier in the day on Saturday inviting me to join them for dinner at an AirBnB they had rented for their family in Bette Gris, which is fairly close to Copper Harbor. Needless to say, Dan and I said yes to their invitation. We had a wonderful evening of food and conversation. Our conversation ranged from discussion of the "Copper Country," God's providence in so many ways, the goodness and beauty of creation, and the merits of the various Rites and Forms of Catholic liturgy. It was wonderful to spend time with them.


