Lembas Bread

Last week, I referenced this quote from J.R.R. Tolkien on *lembas* bread, which I told you I would include in the bulletin. I find it a great source of encouragement and worthy of meditation as we see in the fictional *lembas* a mere shadow of what we receive every time we receive Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament: "As for himself, though weary and under a shadow of fear, [Sam] still had some strength left. The *lembas* had a virtue without which they would long ago have lain down to die. It did not satisfy desire, and at times Sam's mind was filled with the memories of food, and the longing for simple bread and meats. And yet this waybread of the Elves had a potency that increased as travelers relied on it alone and did not mingle it with other foods. It fed the will, and it gave strength to endure, and to master sinew and limb beyond the measure of mortal kind." (*Return of the King*, 262)

The Gift of the Priesthood

This weekend, in addition to preaching about the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, I am taking the opportunity to talk about the gift and call of the priesthood. Among the things that I will be sharing are these powerful reflections from St. John Vianney, patron of parish priests, from his *Catechism on the Priesthood*:

Saint Bernard tells us that everything has come to us through Mary; and we may also say that everything has come to us through the priest; yes, all happiness,

all graces, all heavenly gifts. If we had not the Sacrament of Orders, we should not have Our Lord. Who placed Him there, in that tabernacle? It was the priest. Who was it that received your soul, on its entrance into life? The priest. Who nourishes it, to give it strength to make its pilgrimage? The priest. Who will prepare it to appear before God, by washing that soul, for the last time, in the blood of Jesus Christ? The priest -- always the priest. And if that soul comes to the point of death, who will raise it up, who will restore it to calmness and peace? Again the priest. You cannot recall one single blessing from God without finding, side by side with this recollection, the image of the priest.

Vocations Are a Gift from God

I'm grateful for the men and women who have heard the call from God here at the Church of the Resurrection in the past. Their call has been heard because of what God has done in their hearts in and through our parish, and most especially within families where vocations are honored and discussed. We are grateful for the continuing process of discernment among Mason Abbott, Brandon Amburn, and Thomas Crowley from our parish, as they discern their call to priesthood as college seminarians. Please pray for them and for all those men whom the Lord is calling to the process of discernment. The Lord loves an open heart, and I think it's valuable to remind everyone that attending seminary doesn't, of course, mean more than that one is pursuing/continuing his discernment. For those who are ordained, the Lord's call becomes clearer over time, and is ratified interiorly and by the Church. A very low pressure opportunity is coming up for those who are curious about what it might mean to take a further step in discerning a call to the priesthood. If you are open to come and see what a next step of discernment might entail, please consider joining me, my brother priests, and Bishop Boyea next Sunday, August 22. Beginning at 3:00 p.m. at Bethany House in DeWitt, there will be a BBQ and time for fellowship and prayer for those young men (and even those not so young) who are curious about seminary and/or feel a call from the Lord to give their lives in service to the Lord. If you are a junior in high school or older who has wondered if God might be inviting you to consider the priesthood, please call me, email me, or talk to me after Mass. And let me thank families in advance for their support of sons and brothers who discern the priesthood, and daughters and sisters who discern the religious life.
