#### Lansing's 34th annual Life Chain

Today (October 3) is Pro-Life Sunday, and we are invited to participate in a peaceful prayer chain witnessing to the sanctity of life. Please gather along Grand River Ave. from Abbot Rd. to Williamston – meeting at Abbot Rd., Brookfield Plaza, Summit Bank near Okemos Rd., St. Martha Church or Main St. in Williamston near St. Mary's Church. The peaceful prayer event will be held from 2:30-3:30 this afternoon, asking God to bless our efforts to promote the sanctity of all human life.

#### Baltimore Catechism

Last weekend, I referenced the first few questions from the *Baltimore Catechism*, which is formulated as questions and answers that can easily be memorized. It provides the first lessons in the faith to children, and to adults as well. May we know these truths, and countless more, as well!

LESSON FIRST ON THE END OF MAN

- 1. Q. Who made the world? A. God made the world.
- 2. Q. Who is God? A. God is the Creator of heaven and earth, and of all things.
- 3. Q. What is man? A. Man is a creature composed of body and soul, and made to the image and likeness of God.
- 6. Q. Why did God make you? A. God made me to know Him, to love Him, and to serve Him in this world, and to be happy with Him forever in the next.
- 9. Q. What must we do to save our souls? A. To save our souls, we must worship God by faith, hope, and charity; that is, we must believe in Him, hope in Him, and love Him with all our heart.
- 10. Q. How shall we know the things which we are to believe? A. We shall know the things which we are to believe from the Catholic Church, through which God speaks to us.

#### **Convocation Reflections**

It was a great time of prayer, fellowship, and discussion this past week for the priests of the Diocese of Lansing and Bishop Boyea. The focus this year was on our mission and vision as a diocese, and the way that the Realigning Resources for Mission process will be implemented and what it will require of all of us priests. We also discussed an important proposal for a new, more sustainable and just, formula for funding Catholic schools. I have long believed and taught that Catholic education is a common good, not primarily a private good, because it forms hearts, minds, and wills in keeping with our Catholic faith so that they will be able to be salt, light, and leaven in our world. The Realigning Resources for Mission committee is still working on the final report with our recommendations, and we hope to be finished up within the next few weeks. Please pray for Bishop Boyea, the priests, staff members of our parishes, and the members of the RRM Committee as we conclude our work.

After convocation, I headed south to visit some priest friends in Kentucky, and then am spending some time in the Smoky Mountains, hiking and biking. Be assured of my prayers for all of you as I take this time for fellowship and renewal.

As I mentioned last weekend, we are only able to do this if we have sufficient number of volunteers to not overly burden anyone. We are especially in need for volunteers for the 8:00 and 11:30 a.m. Masses. Thanks to those who have faithfully served, and those who will respond to this call to serve, which fosters our time of fellowship on Sundays.

Our regular schedule for *Healing Encounters* is the second Saturday every other month. The normal schedule would have had us hold the next *Encounter* this coming Saturday, October 9<sup>th</sup>. We are going to postpone the Healing Encounter for two weeks, to October 23<sup>rd</sup>.
