October Healing Encounter Has Been Cancelled

Last week, I announced that we would postpone the *Healing Encounter* for a couple of weeks, because of the online healing conference that I wrote about last weekend. We had hoped to postpone it for two weeks, but we have another event that evening, so we going to cancel the October Encounter and look forward to the December *Healing Encounter* the second Saturday of December.

School Auction and Super Raffle

We're looking forward to holding the School Auction again this fall, on November 13th. We will have more details later. Because of popular demand, we will also be holding a Super Raffle at the Auction, in addition to the Live Auction that we typically have. The drawing for the Super Raffle top prize is \$10,000. Other prizes range from \$500 to \$2,000. The drawing for the Super Raffle will be held at 7:30 p.m. Please note that only 500 tickets will be sold. (If fewer than 251 tickets sold the raffle will revert to a single 50/50 prize.) Tickets will be available online and at the parish office. Plan to join us for the Auction on November 13th, as well. It is a great evening of fellowship and fundraising for our school.

Preaching about Money

Jesus talks about money a lot in the Gospels, and not for no reason. "Where your treasure is, there will your heart be also." Today, Jesus tells the rich young man that he needs to sell all that he has and give it to the poor, to show his heart of obedience to God, and to gain treasure in heaven. He doesn't ask us all to do that, but God does want us to live in ways that helps build treasure in heaven, which is more important (and less spiritually dangerous) than having abundant treasures on earth.

Consider these difficult words of Jesus from today's Gospel:

Jesus looked around and said to his disciples, "How hard it is for those who have wealth to enter the kingdom of God!" The disciples were amazed at his words. So Jesus again said to them in reply, "Children, how hard it is to enter the kingdom of God! It is easier for a camel to pass through the eye of a needle than for one who is rich to enter the kingdom of God." A few weeks ago, I preached about money in the context of the second reading, which was taken from James 5. Like Jesus does here, James warned about the dangers of having riches. (The rich can be tempted to doubt their need of God.) During that homily, I spoke about the importance of seeing money as coming from God, and that all we have is given to us as stewards to be used for our own needs, and to support the ministries that work to build up of the Kingdom of God and evangelize and disciple boys, girls, men, and women. Of course, riches are not bad in and of themselves. Far from it! The danger spiritually is when people cling to riches or strive to be entirely secure without needing God. It's that self-sufficiency

that is spiritually dangerous. That doesn't mean that Christians shouldn't plan wisely and save. Just that those of us with riches need to discern whether some of what we have saved for ourselves or our families might be better used today to help spread the Good News. We are blessed to be a blessing, and our generosity is a sign to God that we get that.

Generous Givers

I'm grateful that so many of our parishioners take seriously the challenge to give generously, even sacrificially. Thank you, all of you, who give so freely of what God has given you, of the "first fruits" of your labors and means. At the 11:30 a.m. homily a few weeks ago, I referenced great text from Malachi on tithing. For those who weren't at that Mass, this strong prophetic words highlights the importance of giving God what is due Him. The reason is simple: everything we have is a gift from God, even our very life and gifts are ultimately given to us by God.

Can anyone rob God? But you are robbing me! And you say, "How have we robbed you?" Of tithes and contributions! You are indeed accursed, for you, the whole nation, rob me. Bring the whole tithe into the storehouse, That there may be food in my house. Put me to the test, says the LORD of hosts, and see if I do not open the floodgates of heaven for you, and pour down upon you blessing without measure! I will rebuke the locust for you so that it will not destroy your crops, and the vine in the field will not be barren, says the LORD of hosts. All the nations will call you blessed, for you will be a delightful land, says the LORD of hosts. (Malachi 3:8-12)

When we stretch ourselves in faith, God sees us, and is pleased and He will bless us. That's the promise. As we prayerfully consider our own gifts, time, talent, and treasure, let's be sure to pray for each other, that we would see all our gifts as coming from God, and that we want to invest them to build treasure in heaven.

Striving to Be Good Stewards

As a parish, we believe that we are being responsible stewards of your gifts, and are investing them for the building up of the Kingdom of God and the salvation of souls. If you have concerns about that, please let us know. And if you're able to give a special gift as we draw closer to the end of the year, that will help us continue to invest in our ministry. Thank you!


8th Grade Visit Day at LCHS
