#### **Keep on Praying!**

Please keep praying about the deliberations among the Supreme Court Justices regarding the ruling in the Dobbs case. As you are surely aware, a strong majority opinion draft was leaked this past week, written by Justice Alito. What has been drafted is an answer to our prayers, fasting, and decades of work to overturn the horrendous moral and legal opinion that were Roe v. Wade and Planned Parenthood v. Casev. You are surely aware of the catastrophists who are claiming that overturning these decisions is an attack on Democracy, but, of course, the opposite is the truth. There may well be some unrest in response to this draft, and potentially after the final decision is promulgated, but our system of justice cannot allow itself to be influenced by polls or histrionic claims of pro-abortion advocates. Let us pray that all of those who employ euphemisms about "abortion care" will come to see the truth about the human dignity of all those who are victims of abortion, most of all the innocent children who have suffered and died over these past nearly fifty years. Come, Holy Spirit!

#### **Good Shepherd Sunday**

Each year, the fourth Sunday of Easter is "Good Shepherd Sunday," when the Gospel for the day is taken each year from John chapter 10. Jesus is the Good Shepherd who lovingly calls our names. He longs for us to follow Him. He knows us (if we will let Him!) and we know Him. Sometimes we wander, and He the Good Shepherd lovingly pursues us, calling always our name. Once we come to Him, and open our hearts to receive the Holy Spirit in

power, and we follow Him, Jesus reaffirms His commitment to shepherd us. He gives us eternal life. He gives us Eternal Life in this life, by the power of the Holy Spirit. This is not just a promise for after we die, but a promise for today. Consider now this wonderful promise: Jesus states that no one (nothing, no event, no evil spirit, no person) can take us out of His hand. He then restates the promise, lest we doubt: no one (nothing, no event, no evil spirit, no person) can take us out of the Father's hand. We are safe in the Shepherd's care if we will but remain in His hand. The key is our willingness to remain with Him, to let Jesus our Good Shepherd truly care for us, and to guide us by the Holy Spirit He gave us in our baptism. May the Holy Spirit, the voice of the Good Shepherd guide each of us, and help us by God's grace to never leave the protection of the loving hand of our Lord. Amen.

#### **Pray for Priests!**

Each year as we celebrate the Good Shepherd, I am encouraged and sobered by the example of Jesus who has called me and other priests to serve and shepherd His flock. I count being pastor of the Church of the Resurrection among the truly great gifts to me from the Lord. May I have a heart ever more conformed to that of the Good Shepherd, Jesus the High Priest.

#### A Culture of Vocations

I hope and pray that the Church of the Resurrection will become an increasingly supportive context and culture in which vocations to the priesthood and religious life can be fostered and nurtured. Families, please encourage your sons (and brothers and uncles and grandsons) to prayerfully consider whether the Lord might be calling them to the priesthood, especially on this Good Shepherd Sunday. And please pray that I will be a shepherd with the heart of Jesus

# Let MI Kids Learn Petition Drive

The Let MI Kids Learn petition drive is underway to promote educational justice legislation. Michigan children from low-income families would qualify for "Student Opportunity Scholarships" toward their out-of-pocket educational costs at public or nonpublic schools for tutoring, school supplies, computers, and tuition among other expenses. Donors to scholarship organizations would receive a state tax credit. Low-income parishioners and members of our community would benefit from this initiated legislation, regardless of where they send their children to school. The petitions would place this proposal before the legislature, and, if approved, would not require the governor's signature to become law. As this is a nonpartisan effort, Catholic parishes and schools are allowed to circulate petitions. The Catholic Bishops of Michigan support this effort. Please prayerfully consider signing the two required petitions to create the scholarship program and tax credits to improve the education of Michigan's school children.
