"Take Jesus With You"

Last weekend, among other things, I talked about the temptation to think obsessively about past events, which cause regret, resentment, or shame. If you're going to think about a past event or events, I said, be sure to "take Jesus with you." What does that mean? Here's what Dan Schneider, in The Liber Christo Method, says: For this reason, Liber Christo encourages you to disappropriate (that is, separate and isolate) your emotions from the event by linking them to Christ. This serves not to suppress your feelings but to place them in right order through an act of the will where they are subject to the intellect. An effective tactic is to place the traumatic memory somewhere along the continuum of the Paschal Triduum (the three days of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday). Are you feeling alone and abandoned? Join Jesus in the garden when the disciples abandoned Him. Is your suffering too hard to bear? Unite yourself to Mary at the foot of the cross. Do you feel rejected and ridiculed? Link those emotions to Jesus who was ridiculed by the religious leaders as He hung on the cross. By this simple technique, you begin to form the habit of separating the emotion from the memory. This not only removes

the enemy's weapon against you but also teaches you the value of mental prayer in gaining custody of your thoughts—an essential element of spiritual warfare. A simple way to do this is to place yourself in the particular memory, imaginatively, and to invite Jesus and/or Mary to come into your imagination to speak to you or show you or do something for you, in light of that painful memory. Try it!

A Method for Praying in the Light of God's Love
One general approach to take Jesus with me in

One general approach to take Jesus with me in thinking about past, present, and future events is to follow this four-step process of prayer, which begins by paying attention to whatever is stirring in our hearts. The four-step process is based on insights of St. Ignatius of Loyola, who makes clear that God is always "laboring to love us." Our job spiritually is to open our hearts and allow his love to enter in. How do you open your heart to God? This simple four-step movement in prayer is a helpful description of how you can open your heart and let God do his loving and healing work in you.

Acknowledge ~ First, acknowledge what is stirring in your heart. Observe whatever memory, thought, or desire is strongest in your heart at this moment. Call it by name in your prayer before God. Do not be afraid to be utterly honest with God and yourself.

Relate ~ Relate that thought, memory, or desire to God. You are sitting before God in prayer. Don't pretend

You are sitting before God in prayer. Don't pretend that you are in this alone. Speak to the Lord from your heart in a way that acknowledges his active presence seeking to love you at this very moment.

<u>Receive</u> ~ The Lord is laboring to love you right now. God is moving toward you with love regardless of what you are currently experiencing, whether it be shame, anxiety, fear, bitterness, anger, unbelief, joy, or peace. Receive the love that the Lord is now giving you in the midst of this memory, thought, or desire.

<u>Respond</u> ~ Having tasted the Lord's love around the memory, thought, or desire you noticed in your heart, respond. Take action. Perhaps say a new "yes" to God's call or choose to obey God's leading. Renounce any of the enemy's lies you have believed about yourself and about God's love. In all things, give God thanks and praise.




