Each fall, as we begin a new season of learning, we also begin programming for those who are interested in learning more about the Catholic faith. Perhaps that's you or someone you know. Let's keep praying for others, and witnessing to them, as we share in our lives and with our words what it means to be Catholic Christians.

Be Anxious for Nothing

As we soon get into the full swing of the election year cycle, there will be temptations to follow the news very closely for polls, developments, statements, policy positions, etc. To be a responsible citizen requires being informed about policy positions and candidates, but the danger can be that we allow the various claims and counter-claims, the lionization of some and the demonization of others to rob us of our peace. Don't let that happen!

The Lord says, "be anxious for nothing . . ." even elections! We should be responsible and prayerful, but never so concerned that an election or the way the media handle this or that issue or candidate leads us to become more concerned about issues "out there" than the issues "here" over which we really have some influence and control. Stephen Covey, in his 1989 book, 7 Habits of Highly Effective People, describes three circles: Circle of Concern, Circle of Influence, and Circle of Control. The Circle of Concern deals with global issues, like matters at the global political or ecclesiastical levels. The Circle of Influence is smaller and more manageable than the Circle of Concern and grows as we deal with matters that are in the final (smallest) Circle of Control. Let us be prayerful and focus on what is within our grasp, and seek always to influence and witness to others in our circle of influence and leave the broader issues to the Lord. He's "got" it, even if we can't see how He will use this or that for His purposes. The Lord knows what He is about! Let's trust Him. Always.

What We Can Do

We may not be able to address matters elsewhere, but we can focus on being Who we are in Christ here in the Heart of Lansing. I need to grow in holiness more and more so that I can help you and those you love become Whole and Holy in Him. We also need to recommit—to double-down, as it were—on our Core Values, which are the following:

- 1) We are mission-focused. This means we seek to spread the Gospel with joy, to create opportunities for people to encounter the Love of God in Jesus, and to help them grow in maturity as disciples of Christ.
- 2) We are authentically Catholic. This means we embrace and teach the Truth as we find it in and through the Church; we worship in spirit and truth in a way that is both reverent and beautiful; we foster a truly Catholic culture; and we seek to live lives marked by Stewardship.
 3) We are supportive of families. This means we commit to partnering with parents and supporting them in their role as the primary educators of their children in the ways of faith; we seek ways to strengthen marriages; and we provide other practical supports for families.

May we live out our core values and serve our community, right here, right now, in the heart of Lansing. Amen.


Five First Saturdays for Women

Altar Society Funeral Luncheon Coordinator

The Altar Society is looking for a Funeral Lunch Coordinator(s). Interested persons can contact Cindi Currie at 517-484-3279 or curriecindi@aol.com. Here are the details:

- When a funeral is scheduled at the Church of the Resurrection, the Parish Secretary will notify the Funeral Lunch Coordinator (FLC) if the family would like a luncheon. The secretary will provide a family contact name and phone number.
- The FLC contacts the family representative and explains that a caterer will provide the meal. The meal options are discussed, along with the cost per guest. The family rep is asked to select a meal and provide the number of guests expected. (No later than 72 hours prior to the funeral, if possible.)
- The FLC notifies the president of the Circle scheduled to provide desserts that month.
- When a menu is selected and a count given, the caterer is notified.
- The FLC contacts individuals on the volunteer list and schedules for table setup, beverage prep, dessert setup, serving table setup, and cleanup.
- The FLC inventories the supplies in the Mercy Hall Altar Society Storage Cabinet and purchases any supplies needed. (Paper plates, salad bowls, dessert plates, hot/cold cups, napkins, placemats, coffee, lemon drink...)
- The day of the funeral the FLC oversees the setup/prep of the luncheon (and may perform these tasks herself), making sure things are ready. When the guests have arrived, the food is set out on the serving table(s) and replenished as needed. After the meal, the FLC ensures that the dining area and kitchen are cleaned, serving materials are cleaned and put away, and supplies put away.
- The Caterer invoice and payment for the meal are submitted to the Altar Society Treasurer.





