First Saturday Prayer for Women

On Saturday, November 2, we will have the second of five First Saturday mornings of prayer for women. If you missed the first one, feel free to join them anyway. You can extend your five beyond the end of the five that are planned. We will have Mass at 8:15, then there will be adoration for an hour, during which you are invited to pray the Rosary, spend time in meditation on one of the mysteries, and listen to the Lord and Our Lady in prayer. Confession will be available. The Holy Hour will be followed by some fellowship in the Pope St. John Paul II room. Contact Liz O'Neill for more details.

Altar, Ambo, Reredos Progress

Chris Spalding shared images of the reredos in progress, as well the completed altar and ambo at the marble workshop in Italy. He also sent images of the icons for the reredos and the progress Barry Campbell is making on the reredos (wooden surround of the crucifix). We are hopeful that all will arrive and be installed, as we have planned, in late November or early December. Given these developments, we have tentatively scheduled a special (very beautiful) liturgy for "The Dedication of an Altar," with Bishop Boyea presiding, on Saturday, December 21 at 10:00 a.m. Celebrating this Mass on a weekday allows us to use the proper readings and chants for the Mass of Dedication. I will confirm the time as soon as we know the altar will be here. Keep on praying! Thanks.

The Example of Blind Bartimaeus

We can see this heart-felt prayer motivated by desire operative in the encounter of Bartimaeus with Jesus: *They came to Jericho. And as he was leaving Jericho with his disciples and a sizable crowd, Bartimaeus,*

a blind man, the son of Timaeus, sat by the roadside begging. On hearing that it was Jesus of Nazareth, he began to cry out and say, "Jesus, son of David, have pity on me." And many rebuked him, telling him to be silent. But he kept calling out all the more, "Son of David, have pity on me." Jesus stopped and said, "Call him." So they called the blind man, saying to him, "Take courage; get up, he is calling you." He threw aside his cloak, sprang up, and came to Jesus. Jesus said to him in reply, "What do you want me to do for you?" The blind man replied to him, "Master, I want to see." Jesus told him, "Go your way; your faith has saved you." Immediately he received his sight and followed him on the way. (Mark 10:46-52) The question for you and me to imagine in our time of prayer, is what we would say if Jesus asked us what he asked Bartimaeus, i.e., what we want Jesus to do for us, and then to imagine prayerfully what He is saying and doing for us in response to our heartfelt prayer. Let's grow in prayer this year together. Amen!

Solemnity of All Saints

All Saints Day is Friday, November 1, when we celebrate all the saints who have gained access to the everlasting beatitude of heaven. All Saints Day is a Holy Day of Obligation, which means that all Catholics are expected to attend Mass to celebrate the Saints who have gone before us. We will have three All Saints' Masses, a (school) Mass at 8:15 a.m. Mass, one at 12:00 noon, and another at 6:00 p.m.

Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed (All Souls)

November 2 is All Souls Day, when we pray for all our beloved dead, that they will be purified of any attachments to the things of earth. We will have our normally scheduled 8:15 a.m. Mass and a second Mass at 11:00 a.m. The Mass at 11:00 a.m. will be for parishioners and other family members who have died within the last year. (Please call the parish office with the names of your loved ones who have died since 11/2/23 so we can add their names to the prayers that will be mentioned in the commemoration of the dead in the Eucharistic Prayer.) We commend those who have gone before us to the merciful fire of God's redeeming love to perfect those we love. Our loved ones benefit from our prayers and sacrifices on their behalf. Lord, have mercy on all who have died. And may their souls, and the souls of all the faithful departed, rest in peace! Amen.
