

I am very glad that we have a school at our parish. The fruits of that ministry are growing, and we pray that all of our students, faculty, staff, and families will become the saints we are "making." Each year, we have an auction that allows members of the school, parish, and community to gather in order to celebrate the school, to enjoy food and fellowship, and to participate in a silent and live auction. Knowing God's Commands

This week, we hear the "Sh'ma Yisrael," the powerful Jewish prayer that is part of their morning and evening services. The first part of the prayer is taken from Deuteronomy 6:4-9: "Hear, O Israel: The LORD our God is one LORD; and you shall love the LORD your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your might. And these words which I command you this day shall be upon your heart; and you shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise. And you shall bind them as a sign upon your hand, and they shall be as frontlets between your eyes. And you shall write them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates." The Lord created us with rational minds and free wills so that we can respond to the commandments of God. He also makes clear in Deuteronomy that repetition is fundamentally important for learning.

Baptismal Promises

All of this reminds me of the power of the promises that parents & godparents make at a child's baptism. The celebrant explains the sober responsibility parents & godparents are taking upon themselves: You have come here to present this child for baptism. By water and the Holy Spirit he/she is to receive the gift of new life from God, who is love. On your part, you must make it your constant care to bring him/her up in the practice of the faith. See that the divine life which God gives him/her is kept safe from the poison of sin, to grow always stronger in his heart. That's obviously a very important commitment. The 1965 Vatican II Declaration "On


Christian Education", 3 elaborates on this: "Since parents have given children their life, they are bound by the most serious obligation to educate their offspring and therefore must be recognized as the primary and principal educators Parents are the ones who must create a family atmosphere animated by love and respect for God and man, in which the well-rounded personal and social education of children is fostered. Hence the family is the first school of the social virtues that every society needs. It is particularly in the Christian family, enriched by the grace and office of the sacrament of matrimony, that children should be taught from their early years to have a knowledge of God according to the faith received in Baptism, to worship Him, and to love their neighbor." As a parish, one of our core values is to be practically supportive of all parents and families as they fulfill their responsibilities to their children. We do so through our school, on Sundays, and other faith-formation opportunities and programs. As we live out our God-given roles, let's please keep each other in prayer. May we all one day get to heaven and help each other get to heaven, along with all the children God is pleased to call His own!

Consecrating the Election to the Blessed Virgin Mary Fr. Ripperger drafted this prayer, and it's a fitting time to pray it:

Mary Immaculate, living tabernacle of the Divinity, where the eternal Wisdom lies hidden to be adored and served by angels and men; Queen of heaven and of earth, beneath whose sway are subject all things that are lower than God; Patroness of the United States of America, sorrowful and mindful of our own sinfulness and the sins of our nation, we come to thee, our refuge and hope. Knowing that our country cannot be saved by our own works, and mindful of how much our nation has departed from the ways of thy Son, we humbly ask that thou wouldst turn thine eyes upon our country to bring about its conversion. We consecrate to thee the integrity of the upcoming election and its outcome, so that what is spiritually and morally best for the citizens of our country may be accomplished, and that all of those who are elected would govern according to the spiritual and moral principles which will bring our nation into conformity with the teachings of thy Son. Give grace to the citizens of this land so that they will choose leaders according to the Sacred Heart of thy Son, that His glory may be made manifest, lest we be given the leaders we deserve. Trusting in the providential care of God the Father and thy maternal care, we have perfect confidence that thou wilt take care of us and will not leave us forsaken. O Mary Immaculate, pray for us. Amen.


