

This Saturday (February 8th), we will have our next Healing Encounter. It is a time of praise, worship, prayer, and adoration from 7:00 to 8:30 p.m. in the church. Prayer teams will be available to pray for healing and other requests. Come, and invite someone to join you.

Communio/Resurrection Life

Since last summer, I have been talking occasionally about "Communio," which is an organization that we have partnered with (along with the diocese) to help foster growth in relationship skills among all our parishioners. They have rightly noted that strength of marriages corresponds well to strength of faith and faithfulness, and so working to create the conditions for, and the skills necessary to cultivate and maintain relationships in Christ are vital for every one of us. I have mentioned repeatedly over the past few months that "marriage is not easy," as if that weren't obvious. I've done so to encourage those who might be struggling to know that they are not alone. We want to strengthen all marriages, and events we run are not for marriages that are "in trouble," but to strengthen relationships among all who attend. We've had (and will continue to have) events for singles, and we recently had a trivia event for the adults of the parish. Next up will be the "Building a Eucharistic Marriage" Course for couples who desire to strengthen their marriage. At this point, the course is full, but you can sign-up for a waiting list. We also look forward to a time when we can offer the course again. Stay tuned for information about that, as well as other fun events that the "Resurrection Life Team," which Maureen Budd and Debbie McPherson are working with, have scheduled across the year. Feel free to reach out to them or to Ed & Michelle Rivet or Pete & Lisa Kogut if you have interest or ideas for future events. To reiterate: Resurrection Life strives to host monthly events addressing various relationship aspects for everyone-whether single, engaged, or married: young or old. These events combine fun, formation, and outreach, aiming to serve diverse needs. To make participation easier, especially with barriers like childcare, many volunteers are needed. Parishioners are encouraged to help and get involved in these efforts.

"Building a Eucharistic Marriage" Course

Beginning February 20, the Church of the Resurrection is hosting a seven week marriage course called "Building a Eucharistic Marriage." Couples will enjoy dinner together, and watch and discuss a course video. Free childcare is provided to allow parents of young children to participate. To allow these couples to attend, we are in need of many hands to coordinate these date nights for couples. Renovated Church and Vocations

After the recent renovation, all the scriptures are seeming to "come to life" for me in a powerful way. Consider, for example, this reading from Isaiah, our first reading this Sunday:

In the year King Uzziah died,

I saw the Lord seated on a high and lofty throne, with the train of his garment filling the temple. Seraphim were stationed above. They cried one to the other, "Holy, holy, holy is the LORD of hosts! All the earth is filled with his glory!" At the sound of that cry, the frame of the door shook and the house was filled with smoke. Then I said, "Woe is me, I am doomed! For I am a man of unclean lips, living among a people of unclean lips; yet my eyes have seen the King, the LORD of hosts!" Then one of the seraphim flew to me, holding an ember that he had taken with tongs from the altar. He touched my mouth with it, and said, "See, now that this has touched your lips, your wickedness is removed, your sin purged." Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send? Who will go for us?" "Here I am," I said: "send me!" This reading is well-matched with the Gospel today, where we hear the calling of the first apostles. After an encounter with the Lord, we do well to listen for the call of God in our lives. For all of us, each of us, it will be a call to holiness and love. But often it will also be a call to committed love, in marriage, the religious life, or the priesthood. Let us all say, with Isaiah, "Here I am, send me!"

Prayer for Vocations

Today in the Gospel, Jesus calls Peter, James, and John to come after him, and Jesus tells them he will make them "fishers of men." Vocations to the priesthood and consecrated life flow from lives of faith in homes, like yours. It is my daily prayer that all homes in our parish will be filled with rich spiritual soil in which the call of God can be heard and followed. May we foster vocations and respond to the call of God in our lives.
