Ouotes about Universal Calls (Vocations)

Last Sunday, I referenced the universal call to holiness and to love, which applies to all of us in whatever vocation we find ourselves. I said I'd include the references to the Catechism, which I cited. I hope you find them encouraging and edifying.

Call to Love:

CCC1604 God who created man out of love also calls him to love—the fundamental and innate vocation of every human being. For man is created in the image and likeness of God who is himself love.90 Since God created him man and woman, their mutual love becomes an image of the absolute and unfailing love with which God loves man. It is good, very good, in the Creator's eyes. And this love which God blesses is intended to be fruitful and to be realized in the common work of watching over creation: "And God blessed them, and God said to them: 'Be fruitful and multiply, and fill the earth and subdue it.""

Call to Holiness:

2013 "All Christians in any state or walk of life are called to the fullness of Christian life and to the perfection of charity." 65 All are called to holiness: "Be perfect, as your heavenly Father is perfect." 66 (915, 2545, 825)

In order to reach this perfection, the faithful should use the strength dealt out to them by Christ's gift, so that... doing the will of the Father in everything, they may wholeheartedly devote themselves to the glory of God and to the service of their neighbor. Thus the holiness of the People of God will grow in fruitful abundance, as is clearly shown in the history of the Church through the lives of so many saints.67

May we, each and every one of us, grow in perfection, as the various challenges of this life help us become the true persons we are in Christ.


St. Vincent DePaul Simply Give Program


