Forty Days of Lent

This coming Wednesday, we begin again the Holy Season of Lent to prepare our hearts for the profundity of Holy Week. As we prepare for forty days of Lent, let us all fast, pray, and give alms for our own conversion, our parish, and our community. This is a moment of grace and opportunity, for us to be witnesses of the truth and the power of conversion. May we all pray and fast for others, that all men and women will yield their wills to the will of the One who is truly Lord of Heaven and Earth. Please grab a copy of *Lenten Gospel Reflections*, by Bishop Robert Barron on your way out this weekend.

Fasting for Him

As a reminder, Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of Fasting and Abstinence. In the Church, the minimum required fast, which applies to those between the ages of 18 and 59, is to refrain from eating between meals and to limit their eating to one full meal and two lighter meals that do not add up to a full meal. The law of abstinence (refraining from eating meat) applies to those 14 years of age and older. *All Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence*. Let me encourage you to see these days of fasting and abstinence as an invitation to deepen your hunger for God and to discipline the appetites of the flesh.

Ash Wednesday and Beyond

There will be three Masses on Ash Wednesday at which we will distribute ashes. Come pray with us, as we begin our Lenten Journey together. The Masses will be held at 8:15 a.m., 12:00 noon, and 6:00 p.m. See the bulletin for other opportunities to pray more this Lent. Each Friday, we will pray the Stations of the Cross in the church at 6:30 p.m.

Last "Last Gospel"

Three years ago in January, I wrote the following in the bulletin (1/30/22):

Because of the particular confusions of our time and the importance of the light in dark times, I believe it is time for us to return to an old practice. After prayerful

discernment and consultation, I have decided that beginning this weekend, I will proclaim John 1:1-14 after . . . the conclusion of the Mass. The faithful then will be invited to pray the St. Michael Prayer after that. This will change only slightly our practice at the end of Mass. I am convinced that this change will help us be strengthened by the truths conveyed in John 1 This change ensures that we are proclaiming the Last Gospel and praying the St. Michael Prayer after the conclusion of the Mass, final blessing, and recessional. I hope and pray that this will be an aid and encouragement to you. After a period of ongoing prayer, followed by discussion and consultation with the Worship and Liturgy Commission and Leadership Team, I have decided to pull back from reciting the "Last Gospel" after the conclusion of Masses beginning on Ash Wednesday. It is not because I don't think we need to be reminded of the beautiful truths contained in John's Prologue, but rather my realization that we inserted something after Mass rather than "recovered" something. Admittedly, the Traditional Latin Mass included the Last Gospel, but it was proclaimed by the priest in Latin, not to the congregation in English. It was a valuable reminder for the priest, and those who were following along in the missal knew that it was being prayed but it was not proclaimed as we have been doing. I think it best to put that practice behind us. So, beginning on Ash Wednesday, we will conclude Mass with the recitation of the St. Michael Prayer. During Lent, we will then depart in silence. Please note that we plan to print the "Prologue of John" in the back of the St. Michael Hymnbook for those who wish to make it a private devotion of their own after Mass.

"Burying the Alleluia"

After Mass Monday morning, we will have a ceremonial burial of the Alleluia, as a reminder to us that we will not sing that until the great triumphal celebration of the Easter Vigil. We will, of course, have recourse to the Gloria on Feast Days and Solemnities, but no Alleluia until Lent is over. Join us for Mass at 8:15 a.m., and for the burial after that.

Seizing the Days

Let's not waste these forty days. The Church gives us these days of fasting, penance, and almsgiving to open our hearts and lives to the work of redemption. By the power of God's grace, let us work to master our passions, resist the lies and temptations of the Evil One and the world, and become more like Jesus, living (as He always did) in fellowship with the Father and the Holy Spirit.


Cornhole Tournament Sponsors Needed




Lent Almsgiving Opportunity


Lansing Catholic Lawyers Guild Retreat




