Spiritual Warfare

Last Sunday, we read, as we do every year, the account (this time from Luke) of the Temptation of the Lord. The Devil tempted Jesus, and the devil and/or demons tempts us. Of course, the flesh and the world play their parts, as well! Let us be wise to the machinations of the enemy. C.S. Lewis, whom I quoted from, in his The Screwtape Letters (a satirical book filled with letters from a senior to a junior devil), writes the following at the end of Chapter 12: You will say that these are very small sins; and doubtless, like all young tempters, you are anxious to

doubtless, like all young tempters, you are anxious to be able to report spectacular wickedness. But do remember, the only thing that matters is the extent to which you separate the man from the Enemy. It does not matter how small the sins are provided that their cumulative effect is to edge the man away from the Light and out into the Nothing. Murder is no better than cards if cards can do the trick. Indeed the safest road to Hell is the gradual one—the gentle slope, soft underfoot, without sudden turnings, without milestones, without signposts, Your affectionate uncle, SCREWTAPE.

Wounds/Lies and the Truth

The enemy delights in getting us to believe lies about ourselves, about others, and about the Lord. The handouts at the exits include these very powerful prayers. Each of the prayers is powerful, and, as I mentioned at Mass, praying them out loud is more effective than doing so interiorly. Three of them, *Rejection*, *Fear*, and *Hopelessness*, seem to be particularly common and powerful. I commend these prayers to your prayerful reflection:

Rejection: In the name of Jesus Christ, I renounce the lie that I am unloved and unlovable. I renounce the lie that I am not wanted, not desired and not good enough. In Jesus name, I announce the Truth that by virtue of my baptism I am a beloved son/daughter of the Father. I announce the Truth that he loves me so much that Jesus gave his life for me, and that there is no greater love possible (Jn. 15). I announce the Truth that the Love of God has been poured out into my heart through the Holy Spirit. I announce the Truth that I am loved and valued, wanted and desired, and that I am precious in the Father's eyes.

Fear: In the name of Jesus Christ, I renounce the lie that if I trust I will be hurt, disappointed or die. In the name of Jesus I renounce all fear, anxiety, mistrust and distrust. I renounce the lie that I am not safe and not protected. And I announce the Truth that God is my rock, my fortress, my deliverer and my protector (see Ps 23, 27, 91). I announce the Truth that God's perfect love casts out all fear (1 Jn. 4:18). I announce the Truth that I am safe and secure.

Hopelessness: In the name of Jesus Christ, I renounce the lie that nothing ever changes and I will never have what I want. I renounce the lie that my life is meaningless and that I have nothing to live for. In Jesus' name, I announce the Truth that my hope is steadfast in Christ, and that He makes all things new (Rev. 21:5). I announce the Truth that because my hope is in Christ I will not be disappointed (Rom. 5:5); I announce the Truth that 'I am being transformed from glory to glory into the image of Christ' (2 Co. 3:18); that God is at work in me, and what he begins he will bring to completion (Php. 1:6). Therefore I am filled with hope in the good things to come.

Dale Ahlquist Presentation






St. Vincent DePaul Simply Give Program
