

The Incarnation Is Our Hope ...

... and so we celebrate the Solemnity of the Annunciation. In the heart of this Lenten season, we recall that March 25, nine months before Christmas, is when our hope for salvation came to earth. This coming Saturday, we remember and celebrate the "Yes" of Mary, the young maiden, who conformed her will to that of the Father in heaven. Mary said, "Be it done to me according to your word." And it was. She conceived by the Holy Spirit, and became the Mother of Hope, the Mother of Mercy, the Mother of Jesus, the Mother of God! What a great gift it is to remember the joy of the Incarnation as we anticipate the culmination of Christ's life on earth, his Passion, Death, and Resurrection. Tuesday, March 25, we will have two Masses, one at 8:15 a.m. and one at Noon.

The Lord is kind and merciful . . . and Patient too This year on the Third Sunday of Lent, we have the great Psalm response, The Lord is kind and merciful from Psalm 103. It is a beautiful reminder of the how the Lord deals with us in our weakness and sin: He pardons all your iniquities, heals all your ills, He redeems your life from destruction, crowns you with kindness and compassion. The LORD secures justice and the rights of all the oppressed. He has made known his ways to Moses, and his deeds to the children of Israel. Merciful and gracious is the LORD, slow to anger and abounding in kindness. For as the heavens are high above the earth, so surpassing is his kindness toward those who fear him. This beautiful Psalm is one that we do well to recall, anytime we are in need of forgiveness. *He pardons all your iniquities, heals all* your ills! Trust that promise, and keep on turning to him. Our Gospel this week makes clear that the Lord

wants us to bear fruit. That is the expected result of our living in him as baptized sons and daughters of God. Note that the gardener in the parable begged for one more year to be able to cultivate the ground and fertilize the fruitless fig tree. We do well to always seek ways to cultivate the ground in our own lives and allow the fertilizing words and sacraments have their way in us, so that we do, indeed, bear fruit. It is well just here to recall the prayer that we have prayed for over a decade now: Let us pray that every person within the Catholic Diocese of Lansing will come to know and love our Lord Jesus Christ in a personal way, grow in maturity as a disciple of Christ, become actively engaged in the full life of the Church, and joyfully utilize his or her gifts for building up the Kingdom of God and the salvation of souls. It is our prayer for everyone who attends the Church of the Resurrection too. Using our gifts allows us to bear fruit, fruit that will remain.

Resurrection's Fish Boil


