Ascension of the Lord

Jesus is Risen from the dead! For forty days, he appeared to the believers and encouraged them in their belief. He desires to encourage us in our belief as well. The testimony of the Risen One is as relevant to our world today as it was in the first century. Today, we read in the Gospel: Jesus said to his disciples: "Thus it is written that the Christ would suffer and rise from the dead on the third day and that repentance, for the forgiveness of sins, would be preached in his name to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things. And behold I am sending the promise of my Father upon you; but stay in the city until you are clothed with power from on high." We do believe this message, and we thank God for those who have preached (and continue to preach) the Good News "to all nations," including our own. Let's wait, with the entire Church, to be clothed "with power from on high"!

Pope Leo XIV and Artificial Intelligence

On May 10, Pope Leo spoke to his brother Cardinals, and said the following:

... These are evangelical principles that have always inspired and guided the life and activity of God's Family. In these values, the merciful face of the Father has been revealed and continues to be revealed in his incarnate Son, the ultimate hope of all who sincerely seek truth, justice, peace and fraternity (cf. Benedict XVI, Spe Salvi, 2; Francis, Spes Non Confundit, 3).

Sensing myself called to continue in this same path, I chose to take the name Leo XIV. There are different reasons for this, but mainly because Pope Leo XIII in his historic Encyclical Rerum Novarum addressed the social question in the context of the first great industrial revolution. In our own day, the Church offers to everyone the treasury of her social teaching in response to another industrial revolution and to developments in the field of artificial intelligence that pose new challenges for the defence of human dignity, justice and labour.

Then, on May 12, Pope Leo addressed members of the media, and said the following:

Today, one of the most important challenges is to promote communication that can bring us out of the "Tower of Babel" in which we sometimes find ourselves, out of the confusion of loveless languages that are often ideological or partisan. Therefore, your service, with the words you use and the style you adopt, is crucial. As you know, communication is not only the transmission of information, but it is also the creation of a culture, of human and digital

environments that become spaces for dialogue and discussion. In looking at how technology is developing, this mission becomes ever more necessary. I am thinking in particular of artificial intelligence, with its immense potential, which nevertheless requires responsibility and discernment in order to ensure that it can be used for the good of all, so that it can benefit all of humanity. This responsibility concerns everyone in proportion to his or her age and role in society. As I mentioned at Mass last weekend, we need to have our eyes wide open regarding this new technology, and look to the Church for wisdom to know proper limits of the use and parameters for the just application of this technology. Come, Holy Spirit!

Aaronic Blessing

You could, as some families do, bless your children using this formula every evening before they go to bed. The LORD bless you and keep you: The LORD make his face to shine upon you, and be gracious to you: The LORD lift up his countenance upon you, and give you peace. (Numbers 6:24-26) Amen!

Come, Holy Spirit!

As we anticipate the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, may we clear out the clogging effects of sin and unbelief in our hearts, and look forward with eager anticipation for the grace of the Lord to come upon us and those we love next Sunday, when we celebrate the Solemnity of Pentecost.


