Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity

This Sunday, we meditate upon the relationship of love that is the Most Holy Trinity. May we be drawn ever deeper into the life of love by yielding to the promptings of the Holy Spirit, seeking always to do the will of the Father through Jesus Christ our Lord!

Come, Holy Spirit!

As we prayed again last week, we have prayed for a long time the following prayer: Let us pray that every person within the Catholic Diocese of Lansing will come to know and love our Lord Jesus Christ in a personal way, grow in maturity as a disciple of Christ, become actively engaged in the full life of the Church, and joyfully utilize his or her gifts for the building up the Kingdom of God and the salvation of souls. We continue to pray for that purpose, and I invite you to daily or weekly pray the "Come, Holy Spirit!" prayer to guide our efforts. After all, the Holy Spirit is the One who is building our house, our school, and our ministry here. Let us continue to faithfully call out, "Come, Holy Spirit," trusting the Lord's guidance as we proceed. The Lord has given you gifts, and God desires you to know them and employ them for the building up of the Kingdom of God. Please prayerfully discern how you can become more involved in the life of the parish and the Church, especially outside the doors of the church building.

Update on Budget and Offertory

Some of you have read in my previous emails, concerns about our offertory numbers for this fiscal year, and looking forward to 2025-2026. Those were the result of discussions at our most recent Finance Council meeting. I mentioned that I would be sending out a letter to all those who have given to the parish, and that is now in the mail.

What that means is that, if we have record of your giving

for 2024, you should have received (or should soon receive) a letter that I drafted with Richard Budd, Chair of our Parish Pastoral Council, and Thomas Demko, Chair of our Finance Council, inviting you to prayerfully consider your giving and to discern from the Lord whether you might be able to increase your giving to help us cover a gap in our offertory for the coming year. Here are a few paragraphs from that letter:

On June 2, the Finance Council met to discuss our current financial situation and to anticipate the next year. For ten+ years, the parish received gifts (totaling several million dollars) from a generous family, which helped us complete long-deferred maintenance, purchase the parish office, install new windows in the middle school, handicap accessibility to the church, and many other things. In 2020, those donations ended. At that time, Covid hit, and our ministry then was partially funded by PPP loans, which were forgiven, then the Employee Retention Credit. Our preschool received two years of significant grants during Covid, as well. Those funds helped us continue to grow our parish and school. This past year, we had a bequest that allowed us to help cover what would have been a larger subsidy from the parish to support the school. We can no longer depend upon grants and bequests for our budget

The Finance Council will be finalizing our budget for the 2025-2026 fiscal year later this month, and I want you to know that we are committed to be more regular and detailed in our communication of the budget and our financial situation throughout the year. In particular, we will include offertory budget vs. offertory received every month in our bulletin.

As I mentioned in my emails, we are looking at a \$150k to \$200k gap in our offertory to cover our anticipated costs. If we can't do so, we will need to pare back our programs and/or staff. With that in mind, in order to help us anticipate offertory for next year, we are asking each household to go online to let us know what amount the Lord is asking you to plan to give this coming fiscal year, even if you feel the need to maintain your current giving level or to decrease it.

In that letter, I invite everyone to read my Fall 2024 article from Faith Magazine about stewardship of treasure, and then pray about their giving levels. (Copies of that article are at the exits.) As your pastor and as a disciple, I believe in this ministry and will be increasing my giving. I am able to do so, and hope that others who are able, will do so as well, as the Lord leads. Thank you!




