Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi)

Today, we celebrate this great Solemnity, which announces to the world our devotion to Jesus, truly present in the Blessed Sacrament, Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. Our liturgies owe a tremendous amount to St. Thomas Aquinas, a Dominican priest and Doctor of the Church. He was brilliant and prayerful and he handed on to us the fruits of his contemplation, in true Dominican fashion. St. Thomas had a mystical experience while celebrating Mass on December 6, 1273, a few months before his death, after which he stopped writing the Summa. Despite the genius and wisdom of his writing, after the glimpse he was given of the beauty and glory in a vision, he said "I cannot go on . . . All that I have written seems to me like so much straw compared to what I have seen and what has been revealed to me." On another occasion, Jesus spoke to him from the crucifix, saying, "You have written well of me, Thomas! What do you desire?" To which, Thomas replied, "Non nisi te, Domine." Only you, Lord (Jesus). May our hearts and minds be like unto St. Thomas Aguinas, that after an offer from the Lord of anything, we would wisely choose "nothing but Jesus." For, having Him, we have ALL.

2025 Offertory Challenge

I am grateful to those of you who have taken time to prayerfully discern about possibly increasing your giving to our offertory to help us address an expected shortfall in our offertory for next year. Here's a repeat of what I included in last week's bulletin, for those who may not have been here last Sunday:

... if we had record of your giving for 2024, you should have received (or should soon receive) a letter that I drafted with Richard Budd, Chair of our Parish Pastoral Council, and Thomas Demko, Chair of our Finance Council, inviting you to prayerfully consider your giving and to discern from the Lord whether you might be able to increase your giving to help us cover a gap in our offertory for the coming year. Here are a few paragraphs from that letter:

On June 2, the Finance Council met to discuss our current financial situation and to anticipate the next year. For ten+ years, the parish received gifts (totaling several million dollars) from a generous family, which helped us complete long-deferred maintenance, Purchase the parish office, install new windows in the middle school, handicap accessibility to the church, and many other things. In 2020, those donations ended.

At that time, Covid hit, and our ministry then was partially funded by PPP loans, which were forgiven, At that time, Covid hit, and our ministry then was partially funded by PPP loans, which were forgiven, then the Employee Retention Credit. Our preschool received two years of significant grants during Covid, as well.

Those funds helped us continue to grow our parish and school. This past year, we had a bequest that allowed us to help cover what would have been a larger subsidy from the parish to support the school. We can no longer depend upon grants and bequests for our budget

The Finance Council will be finalizing our budget for the 2025-2026 fiscal year later this month, and I want you to know that we are committed to be more regular and detailed in our communication of the budget and our financial situation throughout the year. In particular, we will include offertory budget vs. offertory received every month in our bulletin.

As I mentioned in my emails, we are looking at a \$150k to \$200k gap in our offertory to cover our anticipated costs. If we can't do so, we will need to pare back our programs and/or staff. With that in mind, in order to help us anticipate offertory for next year, we are asking each household to go online to let us know what amount the Lord is asking you to plan to give this coming fiscal year, even if you feel the need to maintain your current giving level or to decrease it.

In that letter, I invite everyone to read my Fall 2024 article from Faith Magazine about stewardship of treasure, and then pray about their giving levels. (Copies of that article are at the exits.)

As your pastor and as a disciple, I believe in this ministry and will be increasing my giving. I am able to do so, and hope that others who are able, will do so as well, as the Lord leads. Thank you!




