You (and I) Have a Mission/Purpose

Last Sunday, as we celebrated the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul, Apostles, I talked about the fact that they were God's chosen vessels, one as Apostle to the Jews and the other as Apostle to the Gentiles. They were chosen, as St. Paul says, from their mother's womb. I preached last week about the importance of each of us. We have gifts, as St. John Henry Newman and St. Teresa of Avila powerfully point out. It is no exaggeration to say that each of us is a vital part in the work that God is doing. Let us never take ourselves "out of the game." Let us, as we've prayed countless times, "joyfully utilize [our] gifts for the building up of the Kingdom of God and the salvation of souls." The world needs Jesus, so God gives us to the world. We have a part to play. You do. I do. Every baptized soul does, and that's not negated by any of our sinful choices. If you wonder, consider Saints Peter and Paul. They were sinners too! God used them, and longs to use you and me as well. Come, Holy Spirit!

St. John Henry Newman and St. Teresa of Avila

I include here the texts from these great saints of God. Take time, prayerfully reflect on these, and beware of the Enemy's desire for you to doubt the truths contained herein:

- 1. God was all-complete, all-blessed in Himself; but it was His will to create a world for His glory. He is Almighty, and might have done all things Himself, but it has been His will to bring about His purposes by the beings He has created. We are all {301} created to His glory—we are created to do His will. I am created to do something or to be something for which no one else is created; I have a place in God's counsels, in God's world, which no one else has; whether I be rich or poor, despised or esteemed by man, God knows me and calls me by my name.
- 2. God has created me to do Him some definite service; He has committed some work to me which He has not committed to another. I have my mission—I may never know it in this life, but I shall be told it in the next. Somehow I am necessary for His purposes, as necessary in my

place as an Archangel in his—if, indeed, I fail, He can raise another, as He could make the stones children of Abraham. Yet I have a part in this great work; I am a link in a chain, a bond of connection between persons. He has not created me for naught. I shall do good, I shall do His work; I shall be an angel of peace, a preacher of truth in my own place, while not intending it, if I do but keep His commandments and serve Him in my calling.

3. Therefore I will trust Him. Whatever, wherever I am, I can never be thrown away. If I am in sickness, my sickness may serve Him; in perplexity, my perplexity may serve Him; if I am in sorrow, my sorrow may serve Him. My sickness, or perplexity, or sorrow may be necessary causes of some great end, which is quite beyond us. He does nothing in vain; He may prolong my life, He may shorten it; He knows what He is about. He may take away my friends, He may throw me among strangers, He {302} may make me feel desolate, make my spirits sink, hide the future from me—still He knows what He is about. (St. John Henry Newman, Meditations on Christian Doctrine: Hope in God—Creator.)


