Bishop Mengeling, R.I.P.

This past Thursday, Bishop Carl F. Mengeling, Fourth Bishop of Lansing, was laid to rest. He died in the early hours of July 1, the Memorial of St. Junipero Serra. Bishop Mengeling was, as he loved to proclaim joyfully about others, a "believer."

Bishop Mengeling was the bishop who ordained me, and I am grateful for his heart of evangelism and his joy in the Lord. He loved the Lord; he loved the priesthood; he loved the people; he loved this diocese; he loved well. Thanks be to God. May he and all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen.

As we begin this new fiscal year, I want to say thank you to all of you who have taken my request to heart (and prayer) and responded with a generous heart. We have received 92 responses to the "Offertory Challenge." I suspect that others have not filled that out, but have made increases to their online giving. Your "yes" to the Lord in terms of financial support of our ministries encourages me and pleases our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Again, thank you!

Stewardship of Time and Talent

A few months ago, I mentioned that my sense from the Lord is that this year is a year that Jesus is calling me (and us) to greater, deeper discipleship. Please pray for me, our staff, and each other, that we will all be more attentive to the Lord's promptings and call in our individual lives, and in our corporate life together as a parish. One conviction I have at this point is that we need to more effectively help connect needs/opportunities and the members of the parish who are well placed and gifted to meet those needs. This sort of discernment, training, and assignment is something that we have long discussed but not moved forward with as effectively as we might. Pray for us as we discern best next steps and prayerfully consider how to "unleash" the countless gifts that we have as individuals and as a parish. As St. John Henry Newman says:

God has created me to do Him some definite service; He has committed some work to me which He has not committed to another. I have my mission—I may never know it in this life, but I shall be told it in the next.

Somehow I am necessary for His purposes, as necessary in my place as an Archangel in his—if, indeed, I fail, He can raise another, as He could make the stones children of Abraham. Yet I have a part in this great work; I am a link in a chain, a bond of connection between persons. He has not created me for naught. I shall do good, I shall do His work; I shall be an angel of peace, a preacher of truth in my own place, while not intending it, if I do but keep His commandments and serve Him in my calling.

Let us pray that every person within the parish would find ways to grow in their relationship with the Lord, and in loving service of God and our neighbors. Ideally, we will all sense that we have a part to play, that we have a "definite service" to perform, and that all of us will know what work the Lord has "committed" to us. Come, Holy Spirit!

Vocations Are a Gift from God

I'm grateful for the men and women who have heard the call from God here at the Church of the Resurrection in the past. Their call has been heard because of what God has done in their hearts in and through our parish, and most especially within families where vocations are honored and discussed. We are grateful for the continuing process of discernment among Charlie Gates, Mason Abbott, and Joseph and Thomas Crowley from our parish, as they discern their call to priesthood or religious life. Please pray for them and for all those men whom the Lord is calling to the process of discernment. The Lord loves an open heart, and I think it's valuable to remind everyone that attending seminary doesn't, of course, mean more than that one is pursuing/continuing his discernment. For those who are ordained, the Lord's call becomes clearer over time, and is ratified interiorly and by the Church.

Men's Discernment Retreat (August 12-14)

Next month, a Men's Discernment Retreat for young men ages 16-25 will be offered at St. Francis Retreat Center from 4:00 p.m., August 12 to 11:00 a.m., August 14. This retreat is a chance for men to learn more about the discernment process and meet men who are already in formation, ask questions about the life and ministry of a priest, and provides an opportunity to experience the camaraderie of other discerners. Daily Mass and the opportunity for Confession and Adoration will be offered. Rooms are private with a shared bathroom. The weekend includes Tuesday dinner - Thursday breakfast.

2025 Bishop's Discernment Talk & Dinner (August 17)

For those young men who are high school juniors or above, I invite you to join Bishop Boyea, priests of the Diocese of Lansing, seminarians, and other young men who are wondering if the Lord might be calling them to the Priesthood. The social gathering, talk, and dinner will be held at St. Francis Retreat Center in DeWitt on Sunday, August 17, 2025. You will hear an informative talk on discerning the priesthood and what seminary formation is about, followed by a Q & A session and a BBQ dinner. 
