#### **Deus Caritas Est (God Is Love)**

Last Sunday, we heard the Parable of the Good Samaritan, and in my homily I quoted from Pope Benedict's 2005 Encyclical, Deus Caritas Est. Here are some of the quotes I shared last week, as I preached about the challenges that this reality places on me, you, our parish, and local Church:

15. The parable of the Good Samaritan (cf. Lk 10:25-37) offers two particularly important clarifications. Until that time, the concept of "neighbor" was understood as referring essentially to one's countrymen and to foreigners who had settled in the land of Israel; in other words, to the closely-knit community of a single country or people. This limit is now abolished. Anyone who needs me, and whom I <u>can help, is my neighbor</u>.... The Church has the duty to interpret ever anew this relationship between near and far with regard to the actual daily life of her members . . . [W]e should especially mention the great parable of the Last Judgement (cf. Mt 25:31-46), in which love becomes the criterion for the definitive decision about a human life's worth or lack thereof. Jesus identifies himself with those in need, with the hungry, the thirsty, the stranger, the naked, the sick and those in prison. "As you did it to one of the least of these my brethren, you did it to me" (Mt 25:40). Love of God and love of neighbor have become one: in the least of the brethren we find Jesus himself, and in Jesus we find God . . . . "If anyone says, 'I love God,' and hates his brother, he is a liar; for he who does not love his brother whom he has seen, cannot love God whom he has not seen" (1 Jn 4:20).

The unbreakable bond between love of God and love of neighbour is emphasized. One is so closely connected to the other that to say that we love God becomes a lie if we are closed to our neighbor or hate him altogether. Saint John's words should . . . be interpreted to mean that love of neighbor is a path that leads to the encounter with God, and that closing our eyes to our neighbor also blinds us to God. (Deus Caritas Est, Pope Benedict XVI, 15-16)

Charity as a responsibility of the Church 20. Love of neighbor, grounded in the love of God, is first and foremost a responsibility for each individual member of the faithful, but it is also a responsibility for the entire ecclesial community at every level: from the local community to the particular Church and to the Church universal in its entirety. As a community, the Church must practice love. Love thus needs to be organized if it is to be an ordered service to the community. The awareness of this responsibility has had a constitutive relevance in the Church from the beginning: "All who believed were together and had all things in common; and they sold their possessions and goods and distributed them to all, as any had need" (Acts 2:44-5). In these words, Saint Luke provides a kind of definition of the Church, whose constitutive elements include fidelity to the "teaching of the Apostles", "communion" (koinonia), "the breaking of the bread" and "prayer" (cf. Acts 2:42). . . . As the Church grew, this radical form of material communion could

not in fact be preserved. <u>But its essential core remained:</u> within the community of believers there can never be room for a poverty that denies anyone what is needed for a dignified life.

Let us pray for each other, and please pray for me and our staff, that we will find ways to help meet the needs of those around us (within our parish and in our community) more effectively. Thank you!


