Surrendering and Suffering to Gain Christ

Last weekend, we hear this wonderful (and puzzling) text from St. Paul's <u>Letter to the Colossians</u>:

Now I rejoice in my sufferings for your sake, and in my flesh I am filling up what is lacking in the afflictions of Christ on behalf of his body, which is the church, of which I am a minister in accordance with God's stewardship given to me to bring to completion for you the word of God, the mystery hidden from ages and from generations past. But now it has been manifested to his holy ones, to whom God chose to make known the riches of the glory of this mystery among the Gentiles; it is Christ in you, the hope for glory. (Col. 1:24-27).

St. Paul rejoices in his sufferings, because as he joins them to the suffering of Christ, the Lord is at work in and through him on behalf of the Church. The goal of all his strivings and those of Christ is our salvation, the mystery of which, he continues is "Christ in you, the hope for glory." Your suffering and mine, and the suffering of those we love—when it is united to that of Christ—is redemptive; salvific. Such "embraced suffering" has a transformative effect in ways that we can only rarely see here below. When Judgment Day comes, we will see how all our suffering has contributed to the redemptive work of Jesus. St. Paul, who suffered much, offers us a glimpse of our future glory. Because he can see clearly the spiritual realities of this life, he wrote this letter to the Colossians, which addresses the mystery of suffering.

I know well that many of you are suffering very much indeed and/or are concerned about loved ones who are suffering very much indeed. The Lord invites you and me, and all those who suffer, to take advantage of the suffering, and, as St. Paul does, to view suffering through the lens of God's love. Our suffering (as we are able and willing to accept it) is a way for each of us to become more like Christ and for us to "fill up what is lacking in Christ's sufferings" for the sake of the Church, just as St. Paul did. As we suffer, we can be tempted to numb the pain or reject the goodness of God. But, what's better is to strive, prayerfully and obediently, to join our sufferings to his. One day, we will see just what God accomplished because we chose to suffer through, with, and in Him.




