It's Good to Be Back

As I say every year after I return, though I'm glad I was free to get away, I'm glad to be back. A diocesan priest is not his own; he's for the people God gives him to shepherd. (And that's you!) The Lord's goodness to me in the beauty of Copper Harbor and the surrounding peninsula never fails to refresh me. Offering Mass daily in the chapel was a gift, as well. I met new people and caught up with those who spend half their time there in the summers. I camped, as usual. Some friends were there, as well, at the start of my time there, and my brother Dan joined me toward the end. I had some days in the middle for retreat, reading, riding, and rest. Thanks be to God.

The Soul of the Apostolate

In my homily two weeks ago, I focused on the priority of prayer to active service in light of the Gospel reading from Luke about Mary and Martha. I mentioned that I would give some quotes from the book, should any of you be interested. As you could clearly tell, I was (as I often state) "preaching to myself." When I do that, I can be assured that my homily is relevant to at least one person. I hope and pray that you hear the Lord speak when I speak. That is my heart's desire and my fervent prayer. Come, Holy Spirit . . .

Run, Don't Walk . . .

. . . and get this book! As I said in my homily, the book *The Soul of the Apostolate*, written by Jean-Baptiste Chautard, O.C.S.O (he was a Trappist monk), is powerful and challenging. The Lord used it to call me to repentance, even though the message is not actually very complicated. Pray first; act second. Pray and let actions overflow from prayer. Thinking back to last week's Gospel, the Lord was inviting Martha to sit at His feet as Mary was, not to stay there always, but not to miss the "one thing needful," which is Jesus. Jesus says, "Apart from me, you can do nothing," and Psalm 127:1 says, "Unless the Lord builds the house, they labor in vain who build it . . ." The Lord is the one who makes things happen. He delights to have us be part of His work, but not without Him. We can be so busy that we miss the face of God in our lives. To pause, pray, and then to act out of our prayer—that's what the Lord desires for us. It's unsurprising, in light of what we read in the Gospels, but we often forget. It is good every so often to be reminded.

Transfiguration (August 6)

This coming Thursday, we celebrate the Feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord. In the Gospel this week, we are given the account of the Transfiguration, in which Peter, James, and John are invited to glimpse the Glory of God in Christ, as Jesus talks with Moses and Elijah on the mountain. They hear the voice of the Father, imploring them (and us through them) to "listen to him." May we be among those who do, in fact, "listen to him"

and help others heed his voice and so, by grace, become beloved sons and daughters in the Son who delights the Father.

2025 Bishop's Discernment Talk & Dinner (Aug 17)

This coming Monday, August 4, is the Memorial of St. John Vianney, who is the patron saint of diocesan priests. As I have written for several weeks now, I invite all those young men who are high school juniors or older to join Bishop Boyea, priests of the Diocese of Lansing, seminarians, and other young men who are wondering if the Lord might be calling them to the Priesthood. The social gathering, talk, and dinner will be held at St. Francis Retreat Center in DeWitt on Sunday, August 17, 2025. You will hear an informative talk on discerning the priesthood and what seminary formation is about, followed by a Q & A session and a BBQ dinner. Check-in will start at 4:00pm at St. Francis Retreat Center, dismissal by 6:30pm. You can get more information and register at the diocesan website. 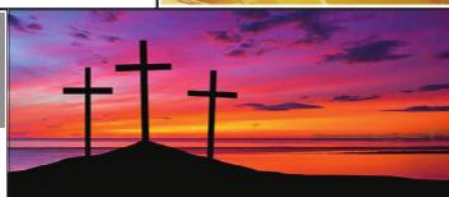
