

Another School Year Begins!

It's amazing, but this Tuesday will be the first day of school. As pastor of the Church of the Resurrection, I am excited about what God has in store for our parish, school, and community this year. Jacob Allstott and the wonderful team of teachers and staff members who make our Catholic school possible have been busily at work to prepare for another year of providing families an excellent Catholic school education here at Resurrection School. If you haven't yet had a chance to talk with Mr. Allstott about what we have in store this year, please contact him by email or by calling to the school office. He and the other members of our staff would be happy to give you a tour and answer any questions you have about the school including how affordable it can be for you and your family. We desire to partner with as many parents as possible in the spiritual, academic, and social formation of children, all of whom are precious to God our Father.

Not Peace, But Division

In this Sunday's gospel, we have one of the most compelling and puzzling statements of Jesus: "I have come to set the earth on fire, and how I wish it were already blazing!...Do you think that I have come to establish peace on the earth? No, I tell you, but rather division. From now on a household of five will be divided, three against two and two against three; a father will be divided against his son and a son against his father, a mother against her daughter and a daughter against her mother-in-law against her mother-in-law against her mother-in-law."

Jesus is the Truth that will lay bear the divisions in human hearts and in communities. Some will accept it, but many will reject it. May we be among those who are more concerned to "stand with Jesus" than to have peace at all costs with those we love. The tragic reality of our time is that many in our culture seem increasingly unable to think clearly, to discriminate what is true from what is false. Many people today seem more guided by feelings and emotions than what reason and revelation tells us true. I see this especially in terms of the response of family members to those who have embraced lifestyles that are contrary to what God commands. Sentimentality, rather than true love, sometimes guides the response of family members to those who are not living in ways pleasing to God. Sentimentality often forces family members to not just love the sinner, but to accept—even at times embrace—the sin. The tradition, of course, tells us that we are to love the sinner, and hate the sin. Sadly, as a culture, we have lost the ability to make that vital distinction. In today's Gospel, Jesus said that division was bound to come, as uncomfortable and painful as it might be. The question today's Gospel demands that we ask is whether we will, in these difficult times, stand with Jesus, or pursue a false peace that pretends everything is fine (and acceptable). The goal of our lives as families, as a parish, and as a school, is be united in the Truth. But where there is truth, some will reject it. In times like ours, when reality itself is under attack by the culture, we need to be willing to suffer the pain of division for the sake of Christ and His Church.

Jeremiah's Sobering Prophecy


In light of today's Gospel, I was reminded of these prophetic words from Jeremiah. It is a sobering analysis of the tragedy within the Church leadership, as well as a criticism of the sentimentality of our times, pretending there is peace when there is no peace.

"For from the least to the greatest of them, every one is greedy for unjust gain; and from prophet to priest, every one deals falsely. They have healed the wound of my people lightly, saying, 'Peace, peace,' when there is no peace. Were they ashamed when they committed abomination? No, they were not at all ashamed; they did not know how to blush. Therefore they shall fall among those who fall; at the time that I punish them, they shall be overthrown," says the LORD.

Thus says the LORD: "Stand by the roads, and look, and ask for the ancient paths, where the good way is; and walk in it, and find rest for your souls. But they said, "We will not walk in it." I set watchmen over you, saying, 'Give heed to the sound of the trumpet!' But they said, 'We will not give heed.' Therefore hear, O nations, and know, O congregation, what will happen to them. Hear, O earth; behold, I am bringing evil upon this people, the fruit of their devices, because they have not given heed to my words; and as for my law, they have rejected it. (Jeremiah 6:13-19) The answer God offers through Jeremiah is that we are to walk in the ancient paths. Some will do so; others won't. Let us be among those who walk in those ancient paths, find life, and encourage, by our witness, others to do the same.


Catechisis of the Good Shepherd

Anniversary Mass


You're invited! Join Bishop Boyea on Saturday, September 27th at St. Thomas Aguinas Parish in East Lansing for a special evening celebrating marriage.


