"Adventures in Marriage" Conference (Sept. 19-21)

As I mentioned last weekend at Masses, we have a marriage conference the third weekend of September. It runs 6-8 p.m. Friday, September 19; Saturday 1-5 p.m. Saturday, and 1-3 p.m. on Sunday. It's a skills based program that allows couples to practice the skills they are learning, as they move through the material. It has very good reviews, in terms of the take-aways from those who have attended the conference. You can get more information or sign-up on our website. This is for any couples that desire to become more skilled at living out their marriage vows wisely and well. (It's not just for those who are "struggling," but it is also (obviously) for them!)

Here are some FAQ about Adventures in Marriage (AIM):

What is Adventures in Marriage?

Adventures in Marriage is a highly interactive program that teaches couples the practical "hands on" skills essential to build a healthy, thriving marriage that can go the distance. This program is internationally recognized as the best in its relationship education field.

What will we learn?

AIM helps couples discover better ways to —

- · Meet one another's needs
- · Communicate
- · Resolve conflicts
- · Express anger
- · Avoid dirty fighting
- · Understand how their personality styles impact relationships for better or worse

Will this program actually help our marriage? Yes, and not just for one weekend. Couples who complete AIM report still using the skills they learned in the course, a year later. This program is effective and has a lasting effect. It teaches couples "how" to be married.

Who is the target audience for this program? Couples at any age or stage — whether you have a great marriage or one that needs extra attention - whether you've been married for five months or 40 years.

We have young children - who will watch them? Onsite childcare is provided on the Resurrection campus!

We're interested, but have you seen the price of groceries? Can we afford to attend? Yes! The weekend costs \$129 per couple. We don't

want money to stop anyone from working on their marriage. Scholarships are available — just contact Debbie McPherson (dmcpherson@corlansing.org).

Note: If any couple is not able to afford even the scholarship amount, they should reach out to me or Debbie. We don't want cost to be prohibitive for couples who feel called to attend this conference. Please pray about this opportunity. Again, you can get more information and register on our website. Space is limited to the first thirty couples. Let's all keep this in prayer. I'm confident couples will find this valuable, whether they've been married five months or fifty years. Come, Holy Spirit!


