

For most of us, the raffle tickets are simply a (potentially very interesting) way to support the ministry of our parish and school. I'll be buying four times as many as I have in the past, since the tickets are \$25. Thanks again for your faithful support of the parish and the Ox Roast!

C.S. Lewis on Suffering and "Punishment."

Last weekend, I quoted from an essay that transcribed C.S.Lewis's answers about Christianity, including this one:

<u>Question 5</u>. Many people feel resentful or unhappy because they think they are the target of unjust fate. These feelings are stimulated by bereavement, illness, deranged domestic or working conditions, or the observation of suffering in others. What is the Christian view of this problem?

Lewis: The Christian view is that men were created to be in a certain relationship to God (if we are in that relation to Him, the right relation to one another will follow inevitably). Christ said it was difficult for 'the rich' to enter the Kingdom of Heaven,' referring, no doubt, to 'riches' in the ordinary sense. But I think it really covers riches in every sense-good fortune, health, popularity, and all the things one wants to have. All these things tend - just as money tends - to make you feel independent of God, because if you have them you are happy already and contented in this life. You don't want to turn away to anything more, and so you try to rest in a shadowy happiness as if it could last for ever. But God wants to give you a real and eternal happiness. Consequently He may have to take all these 'riches' away from you: if He doesn't, you will go on relying on them. It sounds cruel, doesn't it? But I am beginning to find out that what people call the cruel doctrines are really the kindest ones in the long run. I used to think it was a 'cruel' doctrine to say that troubles and sorrows were 'punishments'. But I find in practice that when you are in trouble, the moment you regard it as a 'punishment', it becomes easier to bear. If you think of this world as a place intended simply for our happiness, you find it quite intolerable: think of it as a place of training and correction and it's not so bad

Imagine a set of people all living in the same building. Half of them think it is a hotel, the other half think it is a prison. Those who think it a hotel might regard it as quite intolerable, and those who thought it was a prison might decide that it was really surprisingly comfortable. So that what seems the ugly doctrine is one that comforts and strengthens you in the end. The people who try to hold an optimistic view of this world would become pessimists: the people who hold a pretty stern view of it become optimistic. Lewis, C. Stewardship for Saints and Scholars (S3) Capital Campaign

In coming weeks, you will be hearing much more about the diocesan capital campaign that has been underway for the past year. We are part of "Wave Three" of the campaign, which will wrap up by the end of the year. Each member of the diocese will be invited to consider the goals of the campaign and to prayerfully discern the Lord's leading about their gifts of time, talent, and treasure. When Bishop Boyea became our fifth bishop in 2008, he said that his first capital campaign would be for schools. The first campaign, Witness to Hope had some elements for schools, but S3 is focused on schools and the teachers who make our schools possible. The focus is to ensure that our schools are On Mission, Affordable, and Accessible. Each parish nominates, as well, a "local initiative," for which 20% of the goal would apply. If you are open to helping us with the campaign, please reach out to me. I'm looking for a team to help us have a successful campaign. Let's pray for the success of the campaign here, and for wisdom as we proceed to support our Catholic schools and Catholic school teachers and staff.


