

Stewardship for Saints and Scholars (S3) Capital Campaign

In coming weeks, you will be hearing much more about the diocesan capital campaign that has been underway for the past year. We are part of "Wave Three" of the campaign, which will wrap up by the end of the year. Each member of the diocese will be invited to consider the goals of the campaign and to prayerfully discern the Lord's leading about their gifts of time, talent, and treasure. When Bishop Boyea became our fifth bishop in 2008, he said that his first capital campaign would be for schools. The first campaign, Witness to Hope had some elements for schools, but S3 is focused on schools and the teachers who make our schools possible. The focus is to ensure that our schools are On Mission, Affordable, and Accessible. Each parish nominates, as well, a "local initiative," for which 20% of the goal would apply. If you are open to helping us with the campaign, please reach out to me. I'm looking for a team to help us have a successful campaign. Let's pray for the success of the campaign here, and for wisdom as we proceed to support our Catholic schools and Catholic school teachers and staff.

Training for Security at Masses

This Wednesday at 7:00 p.m. in Mercy Hall, we will have a presentation for those men who are interested in helping with security detail at Masses on the weekends. We will hear a presentation from former police officers about what to watch for and best practices for securing the space (and monitoring the parking lot) during Mass, and what to do if and when (God-forbid) we have a security event. Humility and Pride

At the exits last weekend, I offered the "Litany of Humility," which was written by Raphael Cardinal Merry del Val. It's a very difficult litany to pray. I think, as I mentioned in my homily, that the real aspect from which we need to be delivered is the *demand* to get what we desire. Deliver us, Jesus, from demands on others (and You!).

St. Benedict's Steps of Humility and Pride

The twelve steps of humility:

- 1. In the fear of God to be constantly on the watch against sin.
- 2. Not to love one's own will.
- 3. To submit to superiors in all obedience.
- 4. To hold fast to patience amidst hard and rough things for the sake of obedience.
- 5. To confess one's sins.
- 6. To confess and believe that one is unworthy and useless for anything.
- 7. To believe and admit that one is less than others.
- 8. To keep the common rule of the monastery.
- 9. To keep silent till one is questioned.
- 10. Not to be over-ready to laugh.
- 11. That a monk should speak few and reasonable words with a moderate voice.
- 12. Always to show the humility in one's heart, in one's bearing, keeping the eyes lowered.

The descending steps of pride:

- 1. Curiosity; when the eyes and the other senses attend to what is not one's concern.
- 2. Levity of mind, known by words that bespeak unreasonable joy and sadness.
- 3. Silly mirth, with over-much laughing.
- 4. Boasting and too much talking.
- 5. Singularity, proud esteem of one's own ways.
- 6. Self-assertion; believing one is holier than others.
- 7. Presumption: meddling with everything.
- 8. Defending one's sins.
- 9. Hypocritical confession, which can be tested by harsh reproof.
- 10. Rebellion against superiors and brethren.
- 11. Freedom in sinning.
- 12. The habit of sin.

Bernard of Clairvaux "On Humility and Pride"

Here is a definition of humility: "Humility is the virtue by which a man recognizes his own unworthiness because he really knows himself." This description fits those who have resolved to make the climb and who go from strength to strength, that is, from step to step, until they reach the highest peak of humility, on which, standing as though in Zion, that is, at a vantage point, they see the truth."






