

Stewardship for Saints and Scholars

The Stewardship for Saints and Scholars (S3) Campaign at our parish commences this weekend. The entire diocese is conducting this campaign. Half of the parishes are in this, Wave 3, of the campaign. Over \$41 million has been given or pledged thus far, of the \$70 million overall goal. Our parish goal for this campaign, which is based on a multiplier of our offertory, is \$1,445,000. Eighty percent of the amount raised will go the diocesan elements of the campaign, and twenty percent will go toward helping us pay back a loan that we took to cover masonry repairs on both our school buildings. (The need for the tuck-pointing and other repairs was exacerbated by the pounding of the roads that occurred during the renovation of Michigan Ave.) We are hopeful to be able to put in a new gym floor as well, if the funds come in as we hope. If our parish goes over our target, we will receive 100% of every dollar raised in excess. Our parish has gone through a careful process of consultation and discernment to determine what the most pressing needs are in our community.

I know this may seem daunting, but Bishop Boyea and I have confidence in your generosity. I am grateful for the response that you made to my appeal for an increase in offertory earlier this year, and ask that every parishioner prayerfully consider what the Lord is leading you to give in terms of a response to this campaign, which is a very worthy cause.

For obvious reasons, I would hope that, just as with DSA, any gifts to this cause be above-and-beyond the commitments you have to support our parish through the offertory. Bishop Boyea asks that we all consider what might be a sacrificial gift to this campaign. I am able to, and will give a gift to this campaign, and I invite each of you to prayerfully consider joining me and the other members of our parish and throughout the diocese to help us build for the future. Please be prayerful and discerning yourselves, and pray that others will discern the Lord's leading, as well. Thank you.

Campaign Launch and Requested Gift

At many parishes, the S3 Campaign Launch includes a showing of the campaign video. I highly recommend that everyone view the video at their convenience. We will show the video in

Mercy Hall after all of the weekend Masses for those who wish to see it. I will also send out an email with the link to the video in my parish emails this weekend. You will soon receive (if you have not already received) a letter from Bishop Boyea with the amount that is the diocese's aspirational amount for you (and your family) to give. Please take that to prayer. Some may be able to give that amount; some may be able to give more than that; some will not be able to give anywhere near the amount asked. It would be a great sign to the bishop and his team if all households were able to give a gift of some kind, just as with DSA. But, as I mentioned, neither I nor the campaign volunteers will try to pressure or coerce any particular gift level from you. That is frankly between you and the Lord. Thank you in advance for your prayerful discernment, and for your generosity to the Lord and to our parish. God bless you all!

2025 Life Chain—Sunday, October 5th


