I've been basking in my new freedoms from the digital toxicity, but won't be preaching about it this weekend, you may be pleased to hear. I'll begin (soon) to reflect on our current challenges with the net/web, as I reflect on the challenges and benefits of my new-found freedom on the "Come What May" blog, which hasn't been updated for over a year, I suspect!

Some Quotes

But, in case you were interested, here are some of the quotes I included last weekend in my homilies from Paul Kingsnorth's new book: *Against the Machine: On the Unmaking of Humanity*. The heart of his message is living humanely and more simply, with limits. I think all of us know that would be helpful. Let's pray for each other, that we would know how the Lord is inviting us to live in this networked/webbed world.

'It is hardly likely', wrote Schumacher, in the conclusion to Small Is Beautiful, 'that twentieth-century man is called upon to discover truth that had never been discovered before.' The dangerous results of untrammelled want have been known since the dawn of time, which is why every sane culture has discouraged it rather than making it the basis of its value system. But an ancient problem, as Schumacher's closing paragraph emphasized, will have ancient solutions—if we choose to go looking for them. To those who ask 'What can I actually do?', he said, the answer was 'as simple as it is disconcerting: we can, each of us, work to put our own inner house in order. The guidance we need for this work cannot be found in science or technology, the value of which utterly depends on the ends they serve; but it can still be found in the traditional wisdom of mankind.'[5] (pp. 98-99).

*If Brave New World points us towards the emerging Total System of the Machine, then, it also points us towards the alternative. That alternative, according to. . . Huxley. . . , has always been the same, for millennia, all over the world. It is living within limits, refusing to consume for the Machine, refusing to give the Total System what it wants. It is planting your feet on the ground, living modestly, refusing technology that will enslave you in the name of freedom. It is building a life in which you can see the stars and taste the air. It is to live on the margins, in your home or in your heart. . . . It is to speak truth and try to live it, to set your boundaries and refuse to step over them. It is to be a conscientious objector to the Machine. It is harder and harder to find anywhere to hide from the Machine. But humans are creative. We can always find our liminal spaces—raw or cooked—and there are countless practical ways in which cultural refusal can manifest in our everyday lives. Nothing is easy; everything is compromised. But building anew, building in parallel, retreating to create, being awkward and hard to grasp, finding your allies and building your zone of cultural refusal, whether in a mountain community or in your urban home: What else is there? Kingsnorth, Paul. *Against the Machine: On the Unmaking of Humanity* (pp. 296-297). Kindle Edition.*

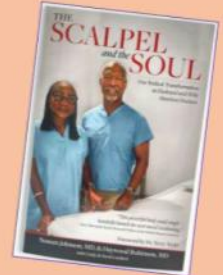
