Catholic Family Rule of Life

During my homilies last week, I invited individuals and families to consider what sort of "rules" are present in their homes that mark the home as distinctively Christian (and Catholic), as well as discerning what limits are operative that reveal that the home is Christian. We need limits (all of us) in a time when the world offers us limitless possibilities, desires, and even demands. A good exercise for all of us would be come up with a "rule of life" that we strive to live by on a daily, weekly, monthly, and yearly basis. I found a Brief Rule of Life for Catholic Families on the Benedictine College website. You can find it here: (https://media.benedictine.edu/a-brief-rule-of-life-for-catholic-families). This is what it suggests for "Family Communication Rules":

Your family member is not your enemy! Disagreements are opportunities to love and grow. Seek resolution, not victory.

When you speak

- Just state the facts don't interpret them or assume you know motives.
- No blanket statements never say "you always" or "you never."
- Don't act out feelings state them; with feelings, telling is better than showing.

When you listen

- Don't interrupt let the other finish and do your best to listen.
- Walk in their shoes try to see the argument from their side
- Repeat back what the other said accurately and fairly.

When you finish

- Always say "I'm sorry" when you realize you were wrong.
- Always reply "I forgive you" to the words "I'm sorry."
- Important: It is not necessary to sound sorry. It is not necessary to sound forgiving. Saying the words is enough.

That's not a bad set of rules. Of course, you and your family might come up with a different set for your life together, but let's each be intentional about living distinctively Catholic Christian lives. Establishing a rule of life (including limits) will be helpful.

All Saints' Day and All Souls' Day

Next weekend, we will celebrate All Saints' Day on November 1 and All Souls' Day the evening of November 1 and on Sunday, November 2. (All Souls' Day will take the place of the 31st Sunday of Ordinary Time.) We will have one All Saints' Day Mass at 8:15 a.m. on Saturday. The weekend Masses will be for All Souls' Day.

Praying for the Dead

November is a month when we remember our loved ones who have died. As we draw near to celebrating All Saints' Day (November 1) and All Souls' Day (November 2), I want to remind you that each year I offer a Mass for

parishioners and their loved ones who have died in the last year. This year, I will do so on November 8 at 11:00 a.m. Mass will be offered for all parishioners and loved ones who have died between November 2, 2024 and November 1, 2025. If you have a loved one who has died this past year, please let Sarah Michaels at the office know, and I will include them in the Eucharistic Prayer. Feel free, of course, to invite families to join us for this Mass. Every time we pray for the dead, we perform one of the spiritual works of mercy. May our parishioners and loved ones rest in peace!

Stewardship for Saints and Scholars

It's been a few weeks since I've mentioned the Stewardship for Saints and Scholars (S3) Campaign. Thank you to all who have already prayed about their gift and those who have made a gift/pledge to the campaign. I've made a gift/ pledge myself, and would be happy to answer any questions any of you might have about the campaign, its purposes and goals, and our part in the campaign. As I've mentioned before, I don't want anyone to feel coerced into giving, but I do invite all of us to prayerfully consider the goals of the campaign, and follow the Lord's leading with regard to a potential gift. As I've mentioned before, the letter from the bishop with a particular amount that you are being asked to give is an aspirational amount, rather than an expectation. Some will be able (and choose) to give that amount, some may discern that they are called to give less. Some may feel called to give more than the amount requested. A few of you have already told me that you (and your families) are unable to give or pledge anything more than your committed giving at this time. Be assured of this: I respect your discernment. I simply merely ask everyone to prayerfully consider the elements of the campaign, and then respond to the Lord's leading. (Thanks in advance!) Should you not have received a letter, you can get a pledge card from Sarah Michaels at the parish office. One final note: If you haven't seen the video for the S3 campaign yet, it's quite good. You can find it (and even make an online pledge) at the campaign website (stewardshipforsaintsandscholars.com).
