Dedication of St. John Lateran

Today, we celebrate the Dedication of St. John Lateran, which is one of the four major basilicas in Rome. We celebrate the Feast Day because it falls on Sunday this year. The same happened last week with All Souls Day, and on September 14 with the Exaltation of the Cross. St. John Lateran is the cathedral church of the Archdiocese of Rome, and we celebrate its dedication. Here's a bit of history taken from vaticannews.va:

When the Emperor Constantine granted full liberty to Christians in 313, they did not spare in order to *construct places for the Lord – numerous are the* churches constructed at that time. Constantine himself also constructed churches, one of which was a magnificent basilica on the Caelian Hill in Rome, over the ancient Lateran Palace, which Pope Sylvester I dedicated to Christ the Savior (318 or 324). A chapel dedicated to Saint John the Baptist was built inside it which served as the baptistry. This moved Pope Sergius III to dedicate it to Saint John the Baptist as well. Lastly, Pope Lucius II also dedicated it to Saint John the Evangelist in the 12th century. Thus, the name of this Papal Basilica is the Basilica of the Most Holy Savior and of Saints John the Baptist and John the Evangelist in the Lateran. Christians consider the Basilica to be the mother church of all churches in the world.

The church was destroyed several times in the course of the centuries, and always rebuilt. The final reconstruction took place under the pontificate of Benedict XIII. The church was rededicated in 1724. It was at that time that the feast celebrated today was established and extended to the universal Church.

One of the beautiful aspects of St. John Lateran is its impressive exterior baptistry, which is an octagonal building outside the basilica, which dates from the fifth century.

Some will be able (and choose) to give that amount, some may discern that they are called to give less. Some may feel called to give more than the amount requested. A few of you have already told me that you (and your families) are unable to give or pledge anything more than your committed giving at this time. Be assured of this: I respect your discernment. I simply merely ask everyone to prayerfully consider the elements of the campaign, and then respond to the Lord's leading. (Thanks in advance!) Should you not have received a letter, you can get a pledge card from Sarah Michaels at the parish office. One final note: If you haven't seen the video for the S3 campaign yet, it's quite good. You can find it (and even make an online pledge) at the campaign website (stewardshipforsaintsandscholars.com).


K of C Euchre Parties




St. Gerard Thanksgiving Dinner
